

美国女作家比彻·斯托夫人出生在一个牧师家庭,曾经做过教师。她在辛辛那提市住了18年,与南部蓄奴的村镇仅一河之隔,这使她有机会接触到一些逃亡的黑奴。奴隶们的悲惨遭遇引起了她深深的同情。她本人也去过南方,亲自了解了那里的情况。《汤姆叔叔的小屋》便是在这样的背景下写出来的。


此书于1851年首次在《民族时代》上连载, 立即引起了强烈的反响,受到了读者的欢迎。仅

第一年就在国内印刷了一百多版,销售了三十多万册,后来被译为二十多种文字在世界各地出版。

评论界认为此书在启发民众的反奴隶制情绪上起了重大作用,被 视为美国南北战争的起因之一。林肯总统后来接见斯托夫人时戏谑地 称她是"写了一本书,酿成了一场大战的小妇人",这一句玩笑话充 分反映了《汤姆叔叔的小屋》这部小说的巨大影响。

《汤姆叔叔的小屋》对社会发展起到了积极作用,特别是对美国 废奴运动和美国南北战争中以林肯为代表的正义一方获得胜利产生了 巨大的作用。美国著名诗人哈里·朗费罗称这部作品是"文学史上最 伟大的胜利"。

此时,他当年的小主人约翰尼·谢尔比已经长大成人,并长途跋涉找到了他,准备赎买他,但他却最终在小主人的怀抱里永远地闭上了眼睛。回到家乡后,小谢尔比以汤姆叔叔的名义解放了他名下的所有黑奴,并告诉他们,是汤姆叔叔使他们获得了自由。



第5章 深入南方


p. 56-57


"约翰尼少爷,"汤姆说,"你已经长成了一个多么好的小伙子呀!赞美上帝!现在我可以幸福地死去了。"


p. 78-79
