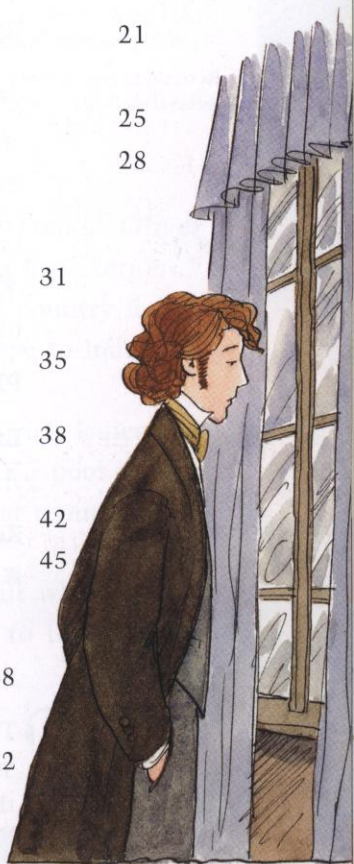

I am Charles Dickens. I am a famous writer. Do you know the names of some of my books? *Oliver Twist*, *David Copperfield*, *A Tale of Two Cities*, *Great Expectations*. Victoria is the Queen. England is a very important country in my time. It has a lot of power in the world from Europe to India and China.

But there are a lot of poor people in England. The rich ladies and gentlemen don't care about them. But I am sorry for the poor people. That is why I write my stories. I want to show that money is not important.

In my story, Pip is a good boy when he is poor. But when he is a gentleman, he is cold and unkind. It isn't good to think about money. It is better to think about people.

The Prisoner on the Marshes



Pip is a young boy. He has no mother and father. He lives on the marshes¹, near the great River Thames. One day he is sitting in the churchyard. He is looking at his parents' graves². Suddenly someone grabs³ him. It's a prisoner. He is escaping from the prison ships on the river. Pip is very afraid.



Prisoner: I want food. Get me some.

Pip: Yes, sir. You must be very hungry, sir.

Prisoner: Yes, I am. And bring me a file⁴ to cut these chains⁵.

But don't tell anyone!

Pip: No, sir!

Pip runs back to the house. He lives with his sister and her husband, Joe. They are poor, simple people. Joe is the village blacksmith¹ and he is very kind. He loves Pip. But Pip's sister is nasty² and bad-tempered³. She likes hitting her little brother. In the middle of the night, Pip steals some food from the kitchen for the prisoner.

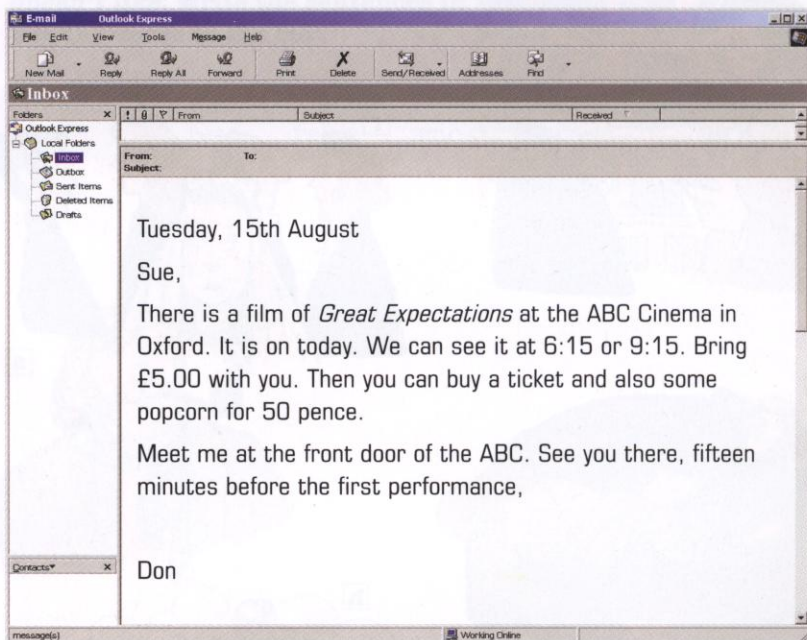

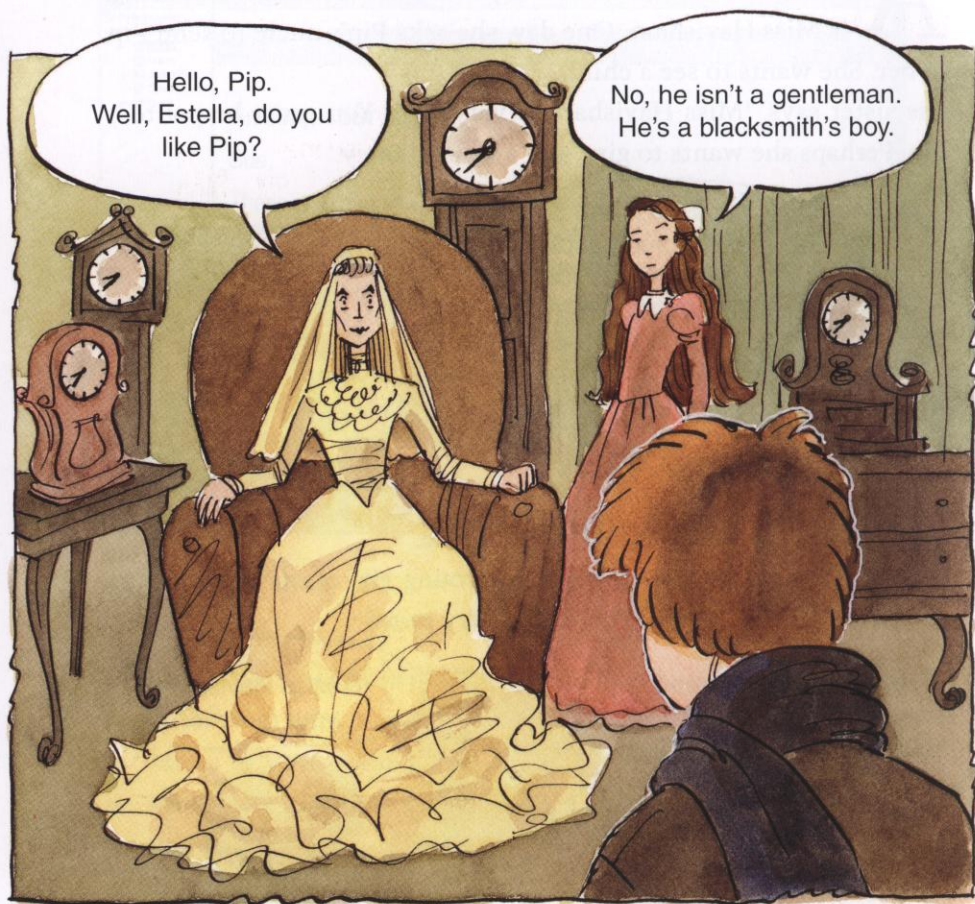

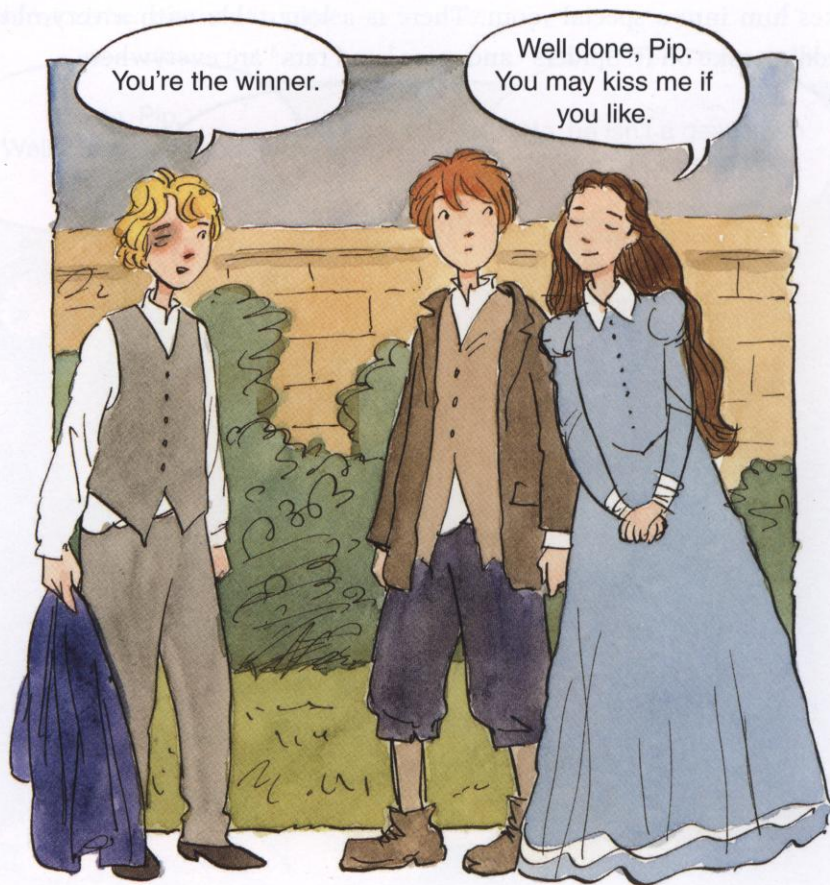

Great Expectations and Kent



ROCHESTER

Rochester is a historic city in Kent, near London. It has a very old cathedral¹ and a Norman castle. The castle is almost 1,000 years old. Dickens was in Rochester a lot. His house, Gad's Hill Place, is near Rochester. There is a Dickens Museum in Rochester and a Dickens Festival every summer and every Christmas.

Great Expectations takes place in Kent and London. Joe's forge² is near Rochester. The coach³ to London goes from Rochester. There is a house in Rochester called Restoration⁴ House. Dickens describes this house when he tells us about Satis House, where Miss Havisham lives.

Near Rochester, on the marshes, there is the village of Cooling. It has a churchyard¹ with a lot of graves. At the beginning of the story, Pip meets the prisoner in this churchyard. The churchyard is near Gad's Hill Place but Dickens is not here. His body is in Westminster Abbey in London in *Poets' Corner*. This is a special part of the Abbey for famous writers.

There is another village called Chalk. Here, you can see a forge. Dickens was in Chalk for his honeymoon². Perhaps this is Joe's forge.

Blacksmiths are very important in Victorian times. Horses are the main method of transport. Everyone needs horseshoes³. People also need metal for other things. Do you know what is the most common English surname?

Transportation to Australia

This is the eighteenth century. The punishment for many crimes is hanging. Thieves and robbers,¹ not only murderers, must hang. But this is a problem for the government. There are too many criminals. We need a new way of punishing them.

The answer is TRANSPORTATION!

This means sending criminals to Australia.

Why is this a good idea?

Because the thieves and robbers leave England.

They can help to build a new country.

WHAT ARE THE PRISON SHIPS?

These are old ships on the River Thames. The navy² does not need them. They are horrible places. They are wet and dark and smelly³. The convicts stay here for several months. Then they go to Australia. Some of them are dangerous criminals. They must stay in Australia for life. Some of them commit small crimes. A servant girl steals something from a shop. She goes to Australia for seven years!

HOW DO THE PRISONERS TRAVEL TO AUSTRALIA?

It is 15,000 miles to Australia. The journey takes 100 days. Ships take the prisoners. Between 1787 and 1868, 162,000 male and female prisoners go from Britain to Australia.

The ships are not good places. A lot of prisoners die from diseases. They have no fresh air below decks⁴. The punishments for prisoners who make trouble are very harsh⁵.

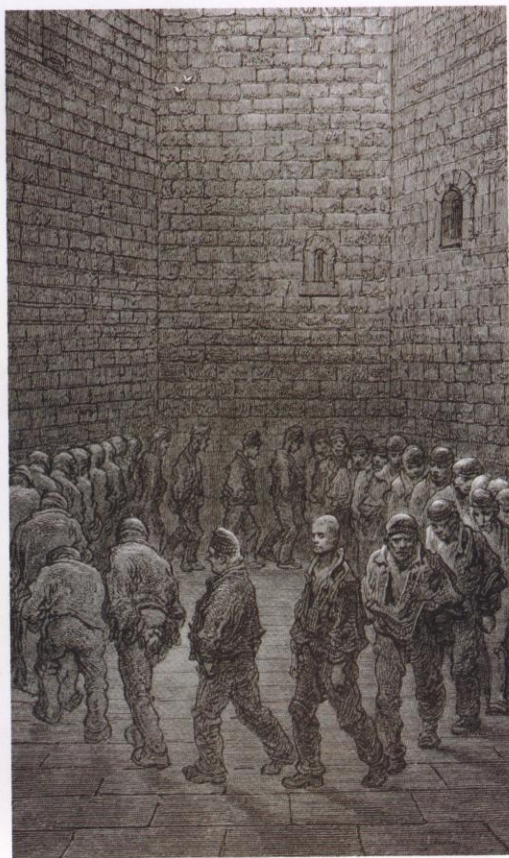

WHAT HAPPENS IN AUSTRALIA?

In Australia, the prisoners work. They help to build new towns.

Sometimes, they become free men and women after a few years.

Often, they become important, well-known and respectable people. The first farmers, brewers¹, millers² etc. in Australia are convicts³. In 1805, Solomon Wiseman is a prisoner. In 1833, he is Governor of Sydney.

But the serious criminals must not return to England. If they do and the police catch them, the punishment is death.

DO THE VICTORIANS HANG MURDERERS?

Yes. Public hangings are very popular. In the story, Pip lives near Newgate Prison. They hang people there.

Large crowds⁴ watch. Some people pay ten pounds (a lot of money in Victorian England) for a good seat.

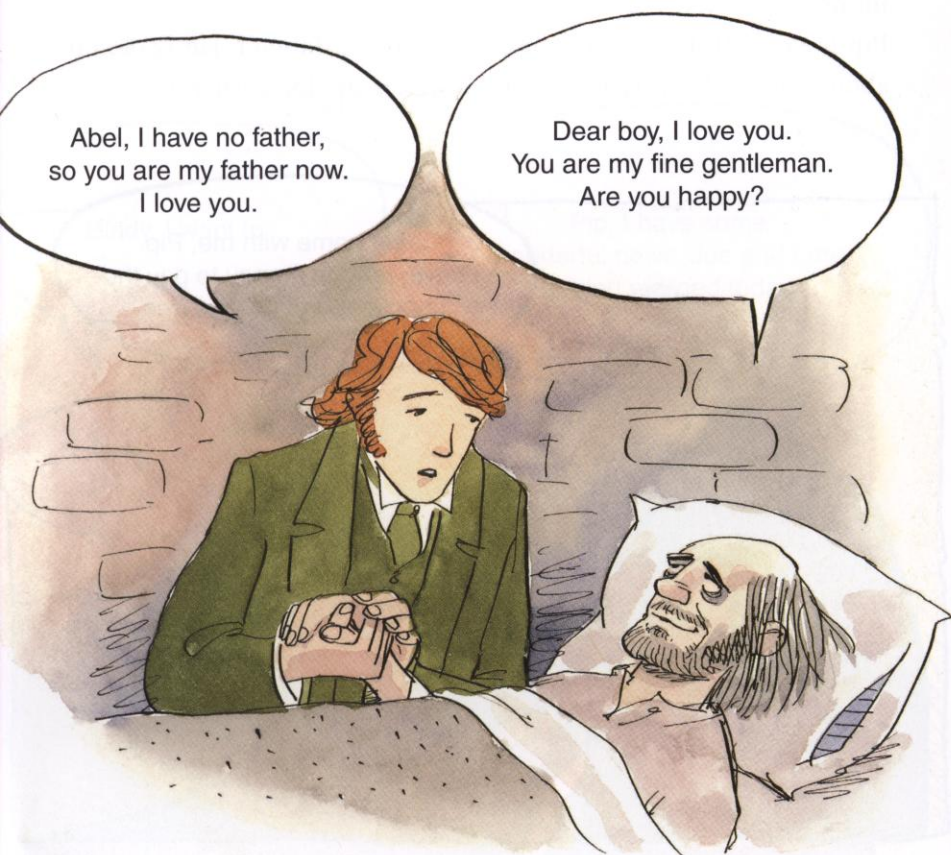

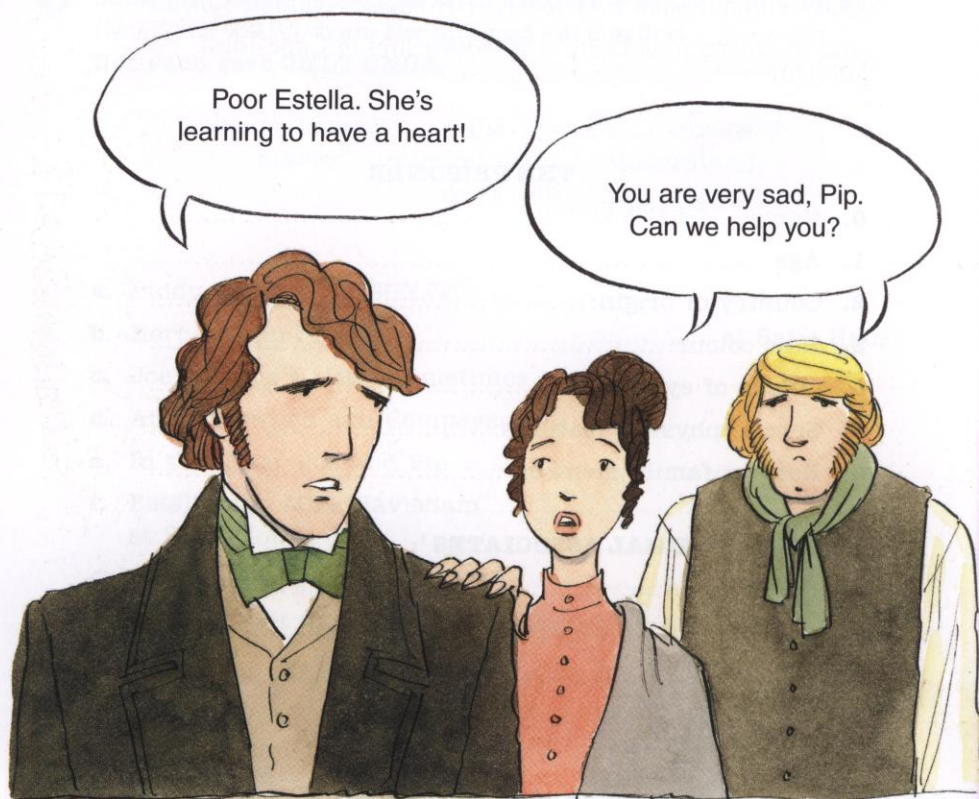

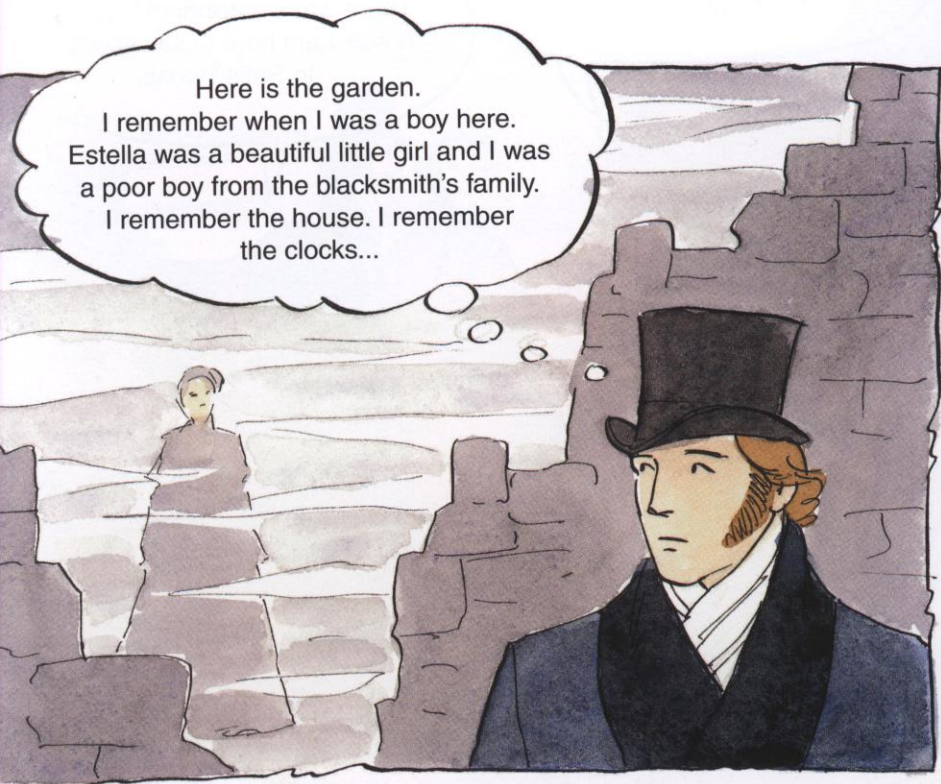

JAGGERS: Someone wants to give you a lot of money. You must go to London. You must learn to be a gentleman.

PIP: Who is my benefactor, sir?

JAGGERS: It's a secret. I must not tell you the name.

PIP: Is it a man or a woman?


JAGGERS: I must not tell you. Don't ask any more questions. Take this money. Buy some gentleman's clothes.

PIP: Miss Havisham must be the person. She wants me to be a gentleman. She wants Estella to be a lady. She wants us to marry. I am very happy.



ACT FOUR

London



Pip goes to London by coach. He sees a big city for the first time. He forgets Joe and Biddy. He only thinks about Estella. He lives in Barnard's Inn in London. In his rooms, he meets Herbert Pocket.


HERBERT: Hello. My name's Herbert.

PIP: Hello. I'm Pip. I remember you! You're the boy in Miss Havisham's garden!

HERBERT: Yes. But now we are friends. I want to show you London. My father is a teacher. He can help you to be a gentleman.

PIP: Then I can marry Estella.

HERBERT: Be careful, Pip. Miss Havisham hates men. Many years ago, she was in love but, on her wedding day, the man wasn't at the church. It was twenty to nine. Estella hates men too.



Pip learns to be a gentleman. He learns to eat politely. He learns to speak politely. He learns to behave politely. Joe visits him in London but he doesn't stay long. Pip doesn't want to talk to his old friend, the blacksmith. Pip is a snob!

JOE: You're a fine gentleman now, Pip. You have fine clothes.

PIP: Thank you, Joe.

JOE: Biddy sends you her best wishes, Pip.

PIP: Thank you, Joe.

JOE: I am going back to the village now, Pip. I don't belong in London.

PIP: Goodbye, Joe.

JOE: Goodbye, Pip.

PIP: I must see Mr Jaggers. I have a lot of new clothes and new furniture. I must ask for some money.

pause

JAGGERS: Mr Wemmick, my clerk, has some money for you, Pip. How much do you want?

PIP: A lot, Mr Jaggers.

JAGGERS: All right, Pip. You are twenty-one years old this year. Your benefactor wants to give you more money.

PIP: But who is my benefactor? It's Miss Havisham, isn't it?

JAGGERS: I cannot tell you.

WEMMICK: Here is your money, sir.

PIP (*to himself*): I am rich. I am a gentleman. Now I can marry Estella!

ACT FIVE

Estella in London

Estella comes back from Paris. Now, she is a lady and Pip is a gentleman. Pip goes to visit Miss Havisham at Satis House and meets Estella. Pip thinks that Miss Havisham is his benefactor.

MISS HAVISHAM: You are rich now, Pip. But the name of your benefactor is secret, I think.

PIP: Yes, Miss Havisham. But I am very grateful.





MISS HAVISHAM: Good. Look. Here is Estella.

PIP: You are very beautiful, Estella.

ESTELLA: Ah, it's the blacksmith's boy. You are a gentleman now! Your shoes are clean!

MISS HAVISHAM: Is she beautiful, Pip?

PIP: Yes.

MISS HAVISHAM: Love her, Pip. Love her, love her, love her.
(She pauses) Estella! Break his heart!

Estella comes to London. Pip is her friend but she flirts with a lot of men. Pip is jealous. At a party, he is talking to Estella.

PIP: Estella, don't dance with other men. Don't smile at them. Marry me. I am a gentleman now. I love you.

ESTELLA: Don't be silly, Pip. I have no heart. I cannot love you. I can only make you unhappy.

GENTLEMAN: Do you want to dance, Miss Estella?

ESTELLA: Yes, thank you, sir. Goodbye, Pip.

PIP: What can I do? Herbert tells me to forget Estella. But I love her.

pause

HERBERT: Meet my friends, Pip. Let's drink together.

STUDENT: Let's drink to our lady friends. Drummle, who is your special friend?

DRUMMLE (raising his glass): To Estella. The most beautiful woman in London!

PIP: You cannot drink to Estella. You don't know her.

DRUMMLE: Why not? I know her well. She is my special friend. I often dance with her.

PIP: You are lying.

HERBERT: Be careful. Everyone is listening.

They meet again next week.

DRUMMLE: Here is a letter from the lady. Everyone can read it.

ESTELLA'S VOICE: 'Yes, I know Mr Drummle. Sometimes, I dance with him. Estella.'

PIP: I am sorry, Mister Drummle. You are right. You are not a liar.



DRUMMLE: And you, sir, are not a gentleman.

STUDENTS: Ha ha! Ha ha!

Pip goes to see Estella.

PIP: Estella, why do you see Bentley Drummle?

ESTELLA: There are lots of men in my life, Pip. I am very beautiful.

Miss Havisham gives me a lot of money. They all want to marry me.

PIP: But, Estella, Drummle is a horrible person. He is cruel and stupid.

ESTELLA: I like cruel, stupid, rich men. Remember Pip, I have no heart.

Biddy writes to Pip. Pip's sister, Joe's wife, is dead. Pip goes back to the village. After the funeral, he speaks to Biddy.

BIDDY: Joe is very sad, Pip. You never write to him or visit us.

PIP: I'm sorry Biddy. But don't worry. I want to visit Joe often now. My sister is dead and he is alone.

BIDDY: I don't believe you, Pip. You are a gentleman now and you don't want to remember Joe and me.

PIP: No, Biddy. I miss you.

BIDDY (to herself): It isn't true. Pip always thinks about Satis House. He forgets his real friends.

ACT SIX

The Visitor

The sound of wind and rain – somebody is knocking at the door.

PIP: Who are you? What do you want?

MAGWITCH: My boy! My boy! Do you recognise me?

PIP: No, I don't know you. Please go away.

MAGWITCH: But I know you. You are my gentleman.

PIP: This is a mistake.





MAGWITCH: No, there is no mistake. You are a gentleman because you have my money! You are my gentleman.

Do you remember the marshes? Do you remember the churchyard? Do you remember the prisoner? I am the prisoner. My name is Abel Magwitch.

PIP: But this is impossible.

MAGWITCH: No, dear boy. You helped me. I remember the food. I was a prisoner in Australia. Now I have a lot of money. I have a sheep farm in Australia. Jaggers is my lawyer. He gives you money from me, dear boy! I am in England to see you.

PIP: I don't understand. Miss Havisham is my benefactor.

MAGWITCH: No, no. You are wrong.

PIP: This is terrible. I cannot take your money. I cannot marry Estella. I hate you!

Now, Pip knows the truth. He tells everything to his friends.

HERBERT: It is dangerous for Abel, Pip. The police want to hang him. We must help him.

JAGGERS: Magwitch must return to Australia.

PIP: It is the end of my dreams. I am poor again.

WEMMICK: Abel Magwitch must hide from the police. His enemy is looking for him.

MAGWITCH: I am happy with you, Pip. You are like my son. I love you. I don't want to go back to Australia.

PIP: Herbert, I must help Magwitch. We must go to Australia together. First, I want to see Joe and Biddy again.

pause

JOE: Pip! I'm so glad to see you. How are you? I'm sorry we have no good food or fine wine for a gentleman like you.

PIP: Don't say that, Joe. I am not a gentleman now. It is a long story and I cannot tell you everything. It is a secret. But I am here to say goodbye.

BIDDY: Goodbye? Where are you going?

PIP: I am going to Australia. I cannot tell you any more. But thank you Joe and Biddy for everything. You are my best friends.



ACT SEVEN

Fire!

Pip wants to see Miss Havisham again. He visits Satis House. Estella is with Miss Havisham.

MISS HAVISHAM: Pip! Why are you here?

PIP: I know everything. You are not my benefactor! You don't care about me.

MISS HAVISHAM: I'm sorry, Pip.

PIP: Estella, marry me. I am poor again but I love you.

ESTELLA: No, Pip. I cannot marry you. I want to marry Bentley Drummle!

PIP AND MISS HAVISHAM: What! What do you mean!

MISS HAVISHAM: Pip, I know nothing about this. I cannot believe it.

ESTELLA: It is true, Miss Havisham. I want to be Mrs Bentley Drummle. Forget me, Pip!

MISS HAVISHAM: Ungrateful girl. You have my money and my jewels and my love. I don't want you to marry a man. I hate all men. I want you here with me. Do you love me, Estella?

ESTELLA: No, Miss Havisham. I cannot love. I have no heart. That is your lesson to me. Goodbye, Pip.

PIP: This is your fault, Miss Havisham. You are a bitter old woman. Estella has no heart because you taught her to hate men. She doesn't love Drummle.

He is rich and handsome but he is cruel. It is a terrible marriage. You are responsible. Goodbye!

Pip returns to London. There, someone gives Pip a letter from Wemmick. It says: 'DON'T GO HOME!'

WEMMICK: Magwitch has a lot of enemies. They know he is in London. They are following you because they want to find him. Abel must hide from them.

HERBERT: Abel must stay with my friend, Clara, and her father. It is near the river.





Miss Havisham asks him to visit her again. He goes back to Satis House.

MISS HAVISHAM: You are sad. Estella is married to a terrible man. It is my fault. Do you forgive me?

PIP: Yes, I forgive you.

MISS HAVISHAM: I want to help you, Pip. I want to give you money. I have a human heart.

PIP: Thank you. But nobody can help me. I want Estella.

MISS HAVISHAM: Don't go, Pip.

PIP (*going*): Goodbye, Miss Havisham.

MISS HAVISHAM: Pip! My dress! The fire! Aaaaaaaa!



Miss Havisham's dress is burning. Pip saves her but the old clothes burn quickly. She is badly injured.

PIP: Poor Miss Havisham. She has nothing now.



ACT EIGHT

The Escape

Wemmick is helping Pip and Herbert. Magwitch must go back to Australia. They make a plan.

WEMMICK: There is a ship to Hamburg. You can meet it at the end of the River Thames. But no one must see you when you leave London.

PIP AND HERBERT: What can we do?

WEMMICK: Row on the river every day. Do the same thing every day. But one day, take Magwitch with you. Row to the end of the Thames where it meets the sea. Catch the ship to Hamburg. Then go to Australia. Then Magwitch is safe.

PIP AND HERBERT: That's a great idea! Let's do it!

One night, Pip and Herbert take their boat to meet



Magwitch. He is wearing a disguise. They row towards the sea at the end of the great River Thames.

MAGWITCH: Thank you, Pip, my boy. But I don't want to be alone in Australia.

PIP: Don't worry, Abel. I am coming with you. There is nothing in England for me. Estella is married.

MAGWITCH: I am very happy, Pip. You are my son. I want you to be with me.

HERBERT: Shh! I think that someone is following us. We must be careful. The police mustn't catch Magwitch in England.

PIP: There's an island. Let's stop the boat and hide on the island for the night.

HERBERT: Yes, in the morning, you can catch the ship.

MAGWITCH: Thank you, my two fine gentlemen.

pause

HERBERT: Look! There's the ship. Row quickly! We must catch it.

PIP: But what's that? There's a boat behind us.

HERBERT: There are four men in it.

PIP: I can see three policemen. And there's another man.

MAN: That's Magwitch. Abel Magwitch.

POLICEMAN: Stop! That man is a prisoner from Australia. You mustn't help him. Stop!

PIP: Row faster! Faster! We must catch the ship.

POLICEMAN: Stop!

ABEL: Who is that man in the boat with the police? I think that I can recognise him. It's my enemy, Compeyson!

MAN: Magwitch, this is the end for you.

MAGWITCH: Compeyson, I hate you.

Pip and Herbert row quickly towards the ship. But the police are catching them. Magwitch is very angry. He hates Compeyson. He jumps in the other boat and fights Compeyson. They fall in the water. The big ship passes over them. Are they dead? Pip dives in the sea to rescue Magwitch.





POLICE: We arrest you, Abel Magwitch. But where is Compeyson?
PIP: He is dead. The wheels of the ship are very powerful. His body is in the water.

POLICE: Come with us. We are going back to London. We are going to prison. This man must die!

PIP: No! He is like my father! Please, don't take him.

MAGWITCH: I am very cold. The river is very cold. My head is bleeding.

PIP: Let me hold you in my arms.

POLICEMAN: Magwitch is our prisoner. He must wear chains.



ACT NINE

Joe to the Rescue

Now, there is a big problem. The police say: 'We must hang Magwitch. He is a criminal.' But Magwitch is very ill. He is dying. Pip is visiting him in prison.

PIP: Abel, I have no father, so you are my father now. I love you.

MAGWITCH: Dear boy, I love you. You are my fine gentleman. Are you happy?

PIP: No, I cannot be happy. I love a beautiful woman. Her name is Estella. But she is the wife of another man.

MAGWITCH: I hope you are happy soon, Pip. Goodbye, I don't have a long time to live...



Abel Magwitch dies. Pip is very sad. He has no money. He has no friends in London because Herbert is working in another country. Pip owes money to the shopkeepers. They are very angry with him and take him to a house. If he wants to be free, he must pay the money.

Pip is very ill. He is dreaming about his childhood. He is dreaming about Joe, his best friend. Then he wakes up. Joe is there!



JOE: Come home with me, Pip. I have enough money to pay the shopkeepers. You are free.

PIP: But you are poor, Joe.

JOE: Money is not important. You are important because Biddy and I love you.

Pip goes back to the country. He lives at the forge again. He is getting better and he is beginning to think about love.

PIP: I love Estella. But she is cruel and she has no heart. Biddy is a very good person. She loves me.

PIP: Biddy, I want to...

BIDDY: Pip, I have some wonderful news. Joe and I are getting married today.

PIP: But... Well, that is wonderful news. You are my best friends. I am very happy. Let me kiss you both.

ACT TEN

Estella!

BIDDY: What's the matter, Pip?

PIP: There is news from London. Bentley Drummle is a very bad husband. He hits Estella. She never goes out. People say that she is very unhappy.

BIDDY: I am sorry, Pip.

PIP: Poor Estella. She is learning to have a heart!

JOE AND BIDDY: You are very sad, Pip. Can we help you?

PIP: No, my friends. I must leave England. I want to go to Africa or Australia. I want to work hard and forget my problems.

Pip leaves England. He works hard in the East and tries to forget everything in the past. After eleven years, he comes back.

PIP: Here is the garden of Satis House. I remember when I was a boy





here. Estella was a beautiful little girl and I was a poor boy from the blacksmith's family. I remember the house. I remember the clocks... But wait. There is someone in the garden. I can see a woman. She is coming towards me through the mist. Who is it?

ESTELLA: Hello, Pip.

PIP: Estella! Why are you here?

ESTELLA: Bentley Drummle is dead. There was an accident with his horse. I am here to say goodbye to Satis House.

PIP: And do you have a heart now?

ESTELLA: Yes, Pip, I have a heart. But it is too late.

PIP: We are friends, Estella.

ESTELLA: We must be friends apart, Pip.

PIP: No, Estella. Now, I know the meaning of my life. Money is not important. Being a gentleman is not important. Great expectations are not important. Friendship is important. We are friends, Estella. We are together. *(He pauses)* There is no shadow of goodbye.

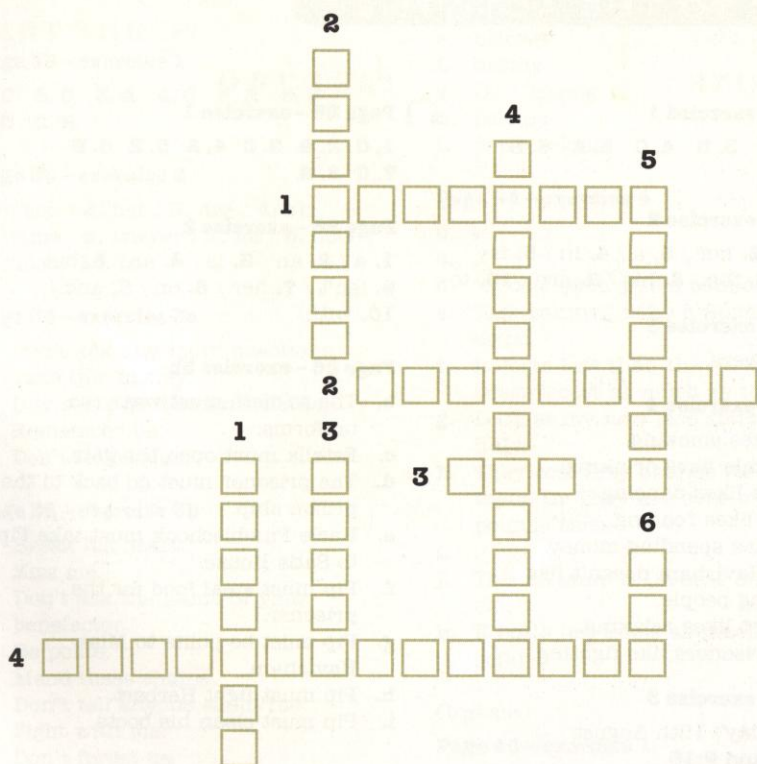
