## Animals in Winter

In winter time it gets cold, snow covers the ground and there is no food. So how do animals survive?



#### Migration

Many birds, fish and other animals migrate in the autumn. They travel south to warmer places and then return in the spring.

#### Adaptation

Some animals like the mole stay and remain active in the winter months. To keep warm they may grow new, thicker fur in autumn. Because food is difficult to find, some animals like mice and squirrels collect extra food and store it to eat later.

#### Hibernation

Some animals such as the rat hibernate during the winter. This is a special, very deep sleep. The animal's body temperature goes down and

its heartbeat and breathing slow down. In the autumn these animals prepare by eating extra food, which is stored as body fat and can be used as energy during the winter.

"Oh, Badger!" cries Rat, "It's me, Rat and





"Good!" says Rat, "We must save poor Toad!"







After the tunnel Toad jumps. He runs into the wood and hides.





The woman looks at Toad under his bonnet. "Yes, you are," she cries, "a horrible toad in my nice clean barge!"





"Toad," says Badger, "you must have a banquet <sup>5</sup> to celebrate your return and you must write the invitations now."




