



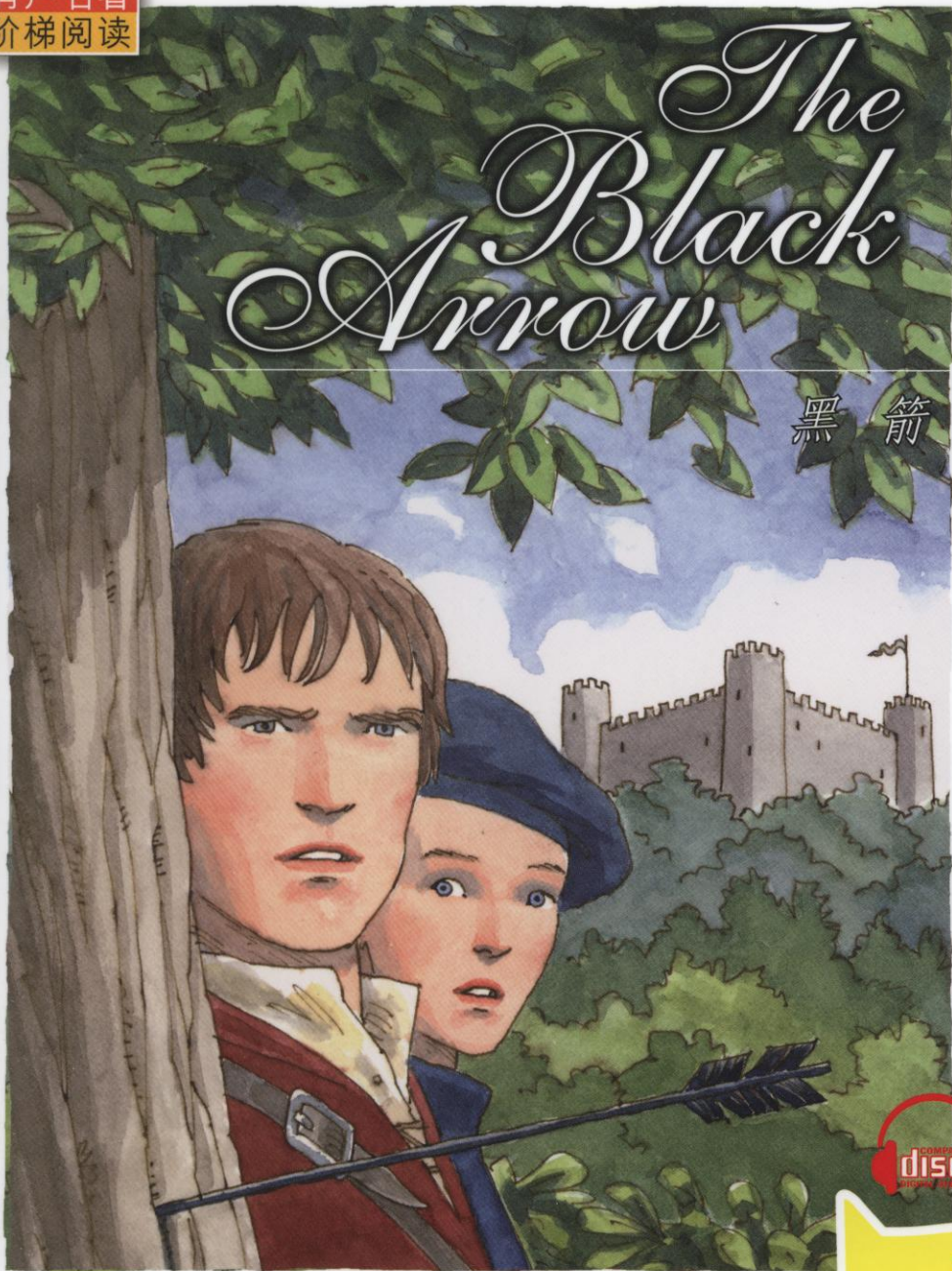

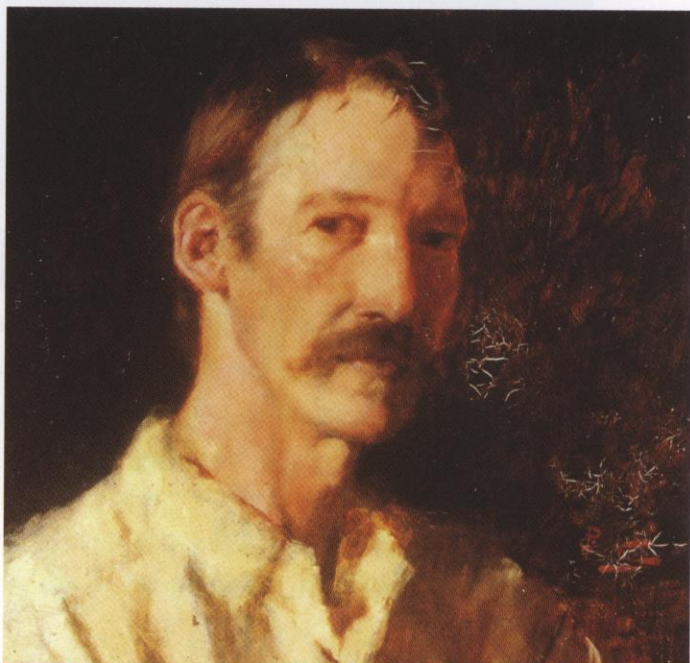

About the Author



Robert Louis Stevenson was born in Edinburgh, Scotland, on 13 November 1850. He was not a strong child and was often ill, but he liked the stories about adventures and pirates which his father told him.

In the late 1860s, he went to Edinburgh University. At first he decided to study engineering because his father was an engineer. But Stevenson soon understood that he was not happy with his choice and decided to study law. It was during this time that he became very interested in literature and he began writing stories. Many of these were published in magazines.

In 1876, Stevenson started travelling through Belgium and France, where he met Fanny Osbourne. She was American, eleven years older than himself and a mother of two children. They fell in love

immediately, but they did not get married until 1880. After their marriage, they went to live in Scotland with her son, Lloyd.

One day Stevenson started telling Lloyd a story about pirates. This was the beginning of one of Stevenson's most famous stories, *Treasure Island*. This exciting adventure story about pirates and treasure became very popular with children and adults all over the world, and Stevenson became a famous writer. In 1886, he wrote his most famous novel, *The Strange Case of Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde*. This tells the story of a doctor who drinks a special potion¹ and develops a horrible new personality. His other important novels include: *Kidnapped* (1886), *The Black Arrow* (1888) and *The Master of Ballantrae* (1889).

In 1888, Stevenson was still ill and he felt that the cold, wet, Scottish weather was not good for him. So the family decided to travel to the South Pacific. They spent two years travelling and visited the islands of Hawaii, Tahiti, Samoa and many others. The warm weather helped Stevenson a lot, so the family decided to live in Samoa. Stevenson liked Samoa and the people very much, and they liked him, too. He studied the life and customs of these people and started writing numerous² stories set on the islands. Some of these stories were published in a collection called *Island Nights' Entertainments* (1893).

Stevenson died in December 1894 in his home in Samoa. He was only 44 years old. The people of Samoa buried³ him on top of Mount Vaea.

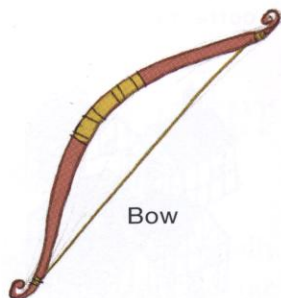

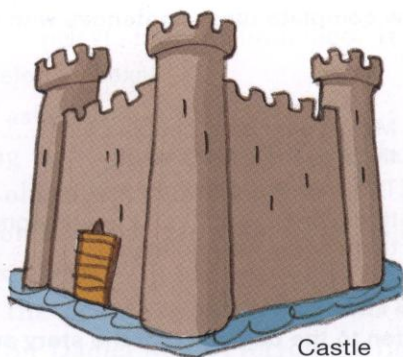

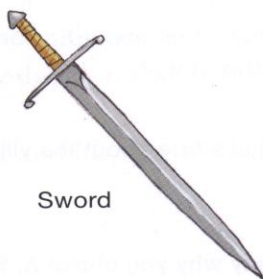

Richard took the letter and went to get his horse.

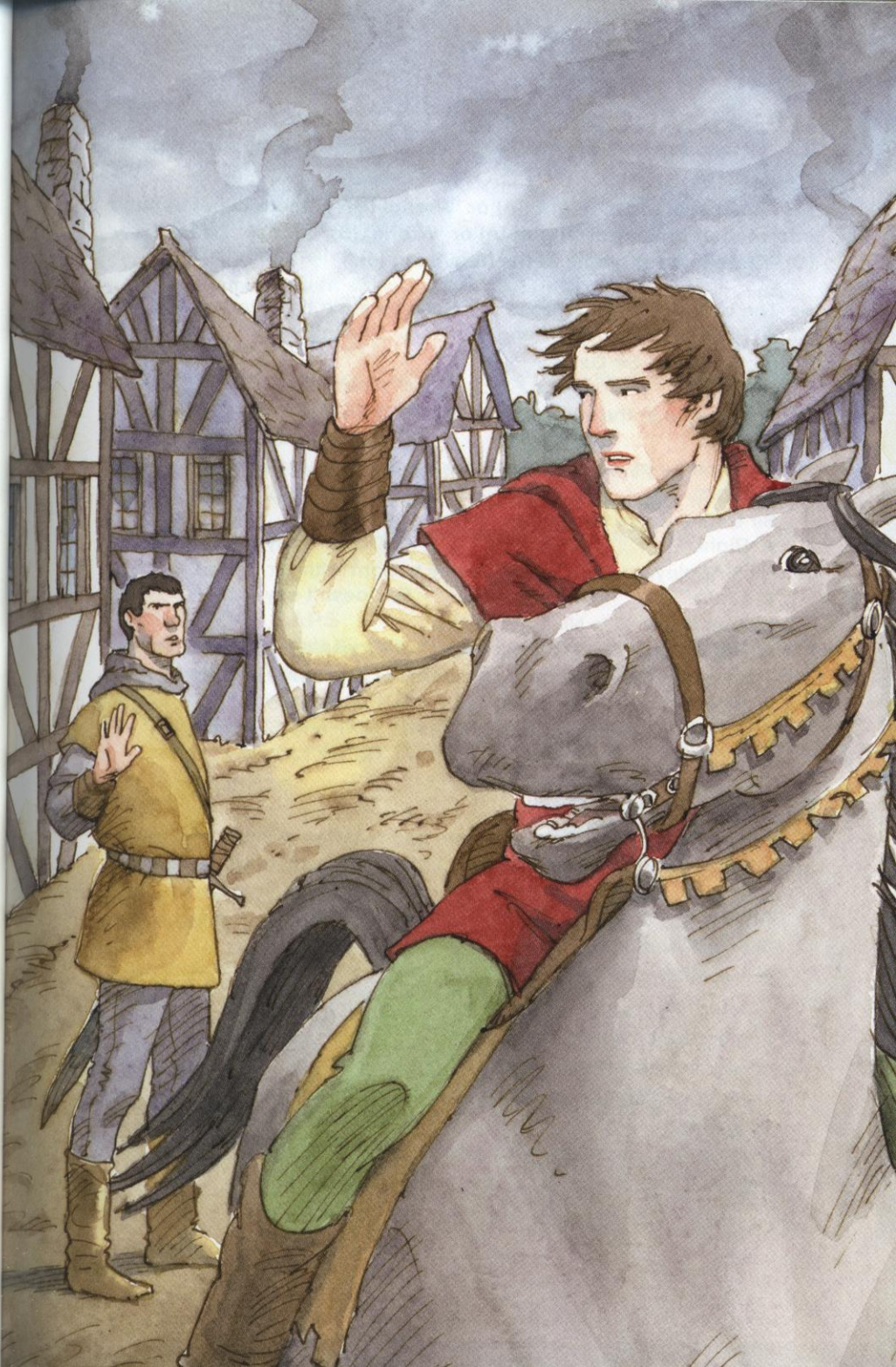

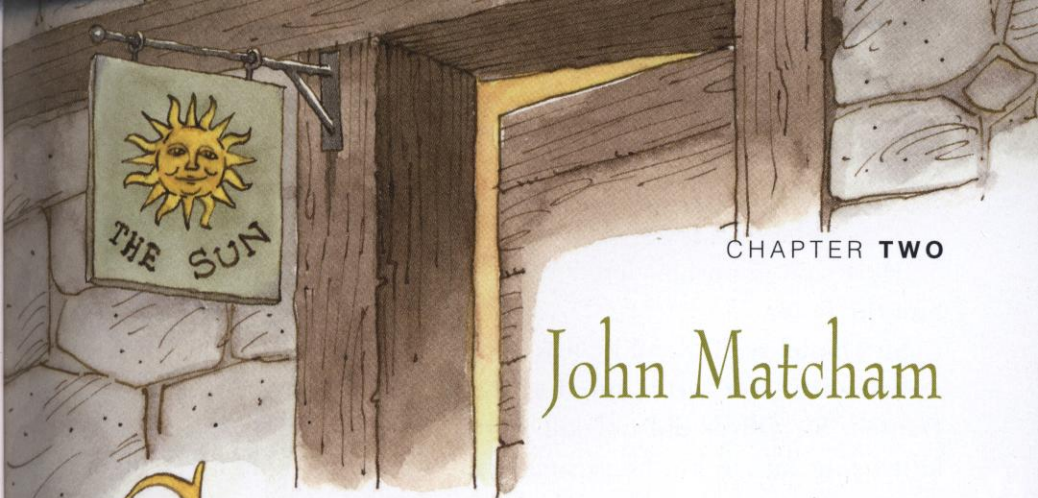

‘Yes, I am,’ he said. ‘I’m lost and my horse hurt his leg in the marsh. Now he can’t move.’

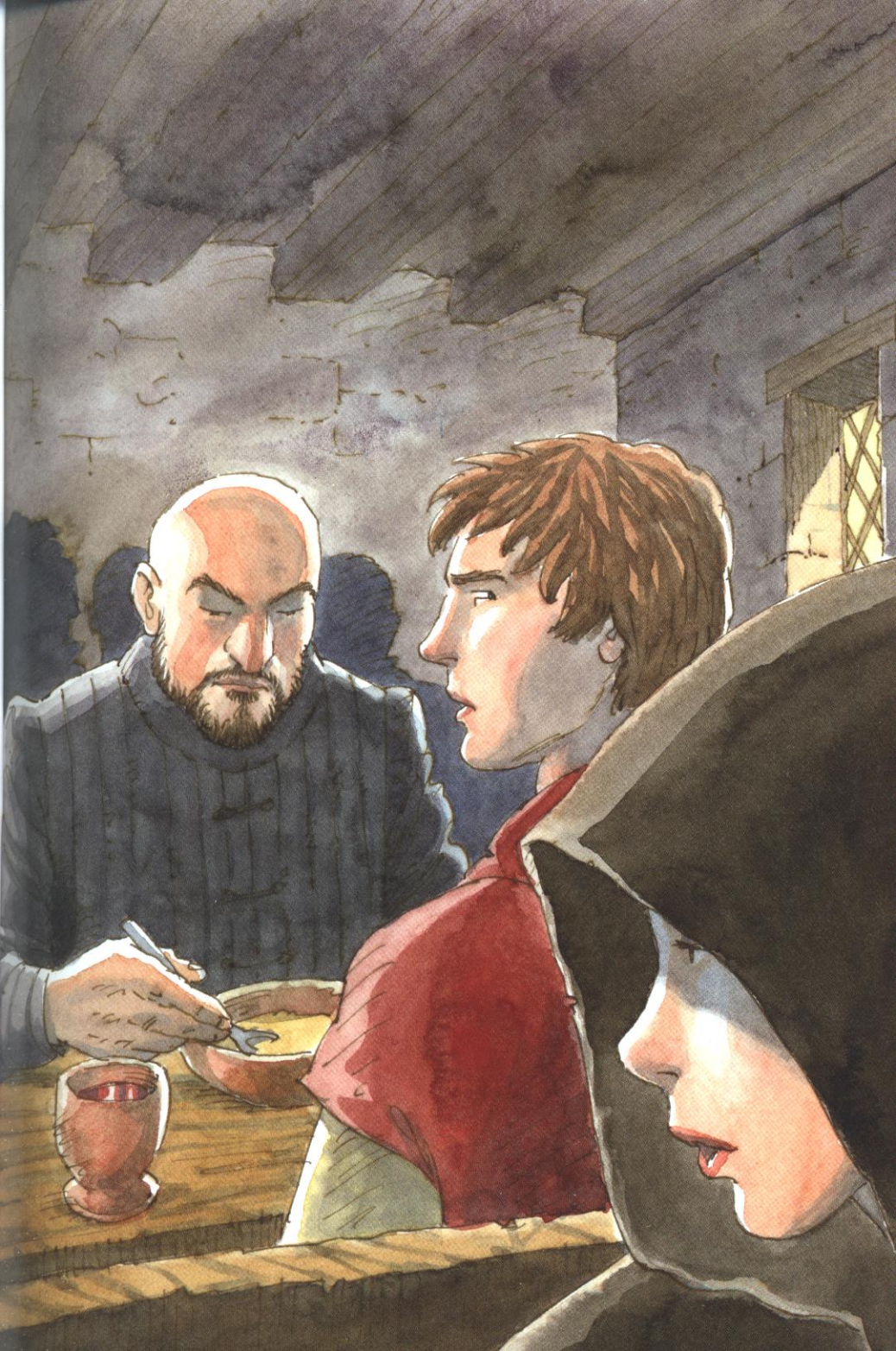

The first battle was in 1455 at St Albans, just north of London. The Yorkists won but Henry VI was still king. Three years passed before the next battle, but between 1459 and 1461 there were eight more battles. The Yorkists won five of these,

and finally, in 1461, there was a Yorkist king for the first time, Edward IV (1461-70, 1471-83).

After Edward IV's death in 1483, the heir¹ to the throne² was the eldest son, Edward V, but he was still a child at this time. Edward IV's brother, the Duke of Gloucester, was the guardian³ of both the boy and his younger brother. The Duke also wanted to be king, so

he decided to put the boys in prison in the Tower of London. People believe that they were killed soon after their arrival and the Duke became King Richard III.

There were seventeen battles during the thirty years of war. These happened all over England: in the north, south, east and west. On 22 August 1485 Henry Tudor, a descendant of the house of Lancaster, won the final battle. Richard III, the last York king, was killed. Henry Tudor then became King Henry VII. A year later he married Elizabeth of York and the Lancaster and York families were joined together. To show this the white rose of York and the red rose of Lancaster became one red and white rose. This was called the Tudor Rose as was the symbol of the Tudors, a new line ¹ of English kings and queens.

'Let's follow him,' said Richard. It was dark outside, but they could see Sir Daniel and his men walking towards the sea.

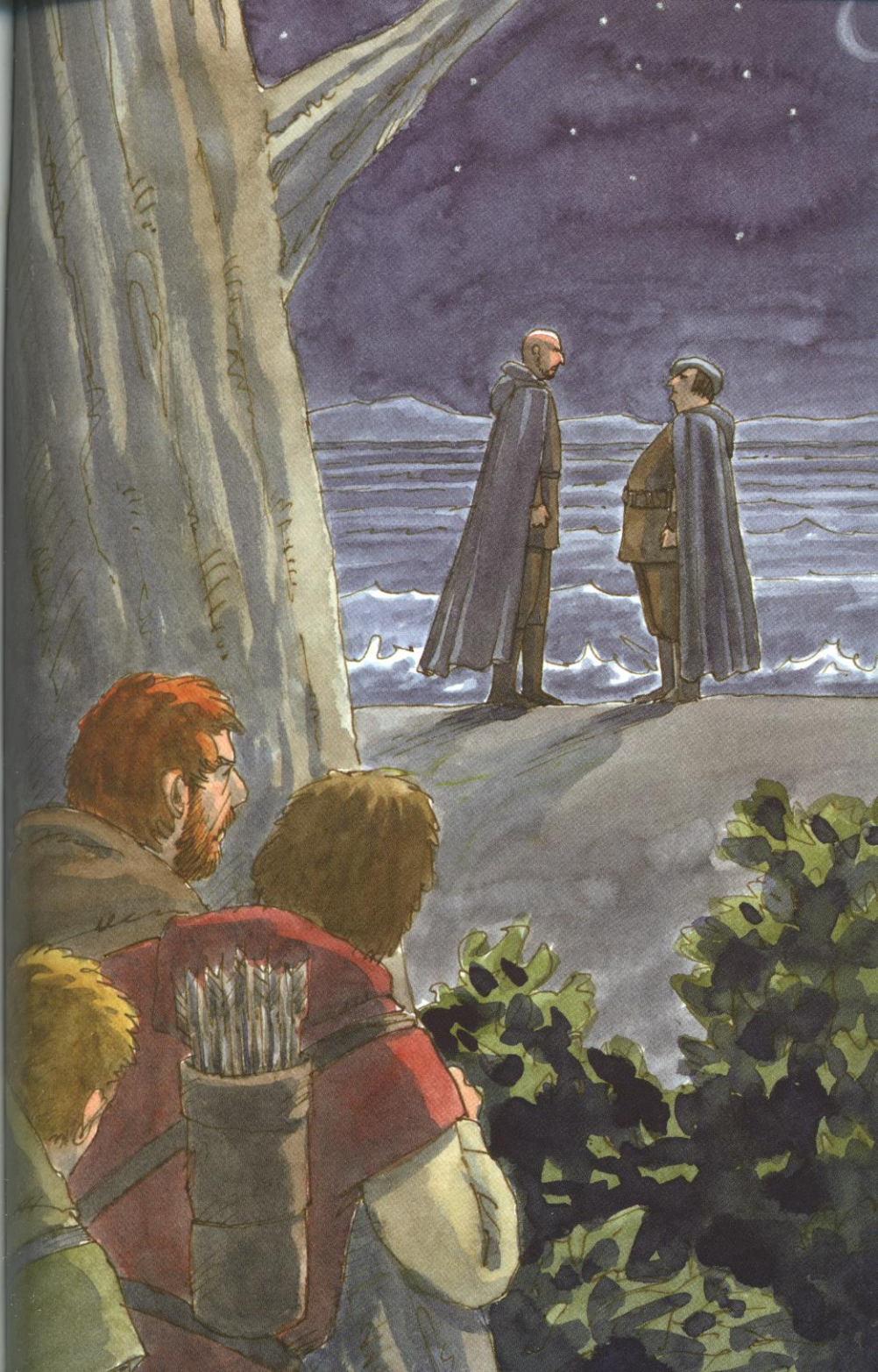
Near the sea they saw an old lord ² with some men. He was short and fat. He met Sir Daniel in front of a stone house with a wall around it.

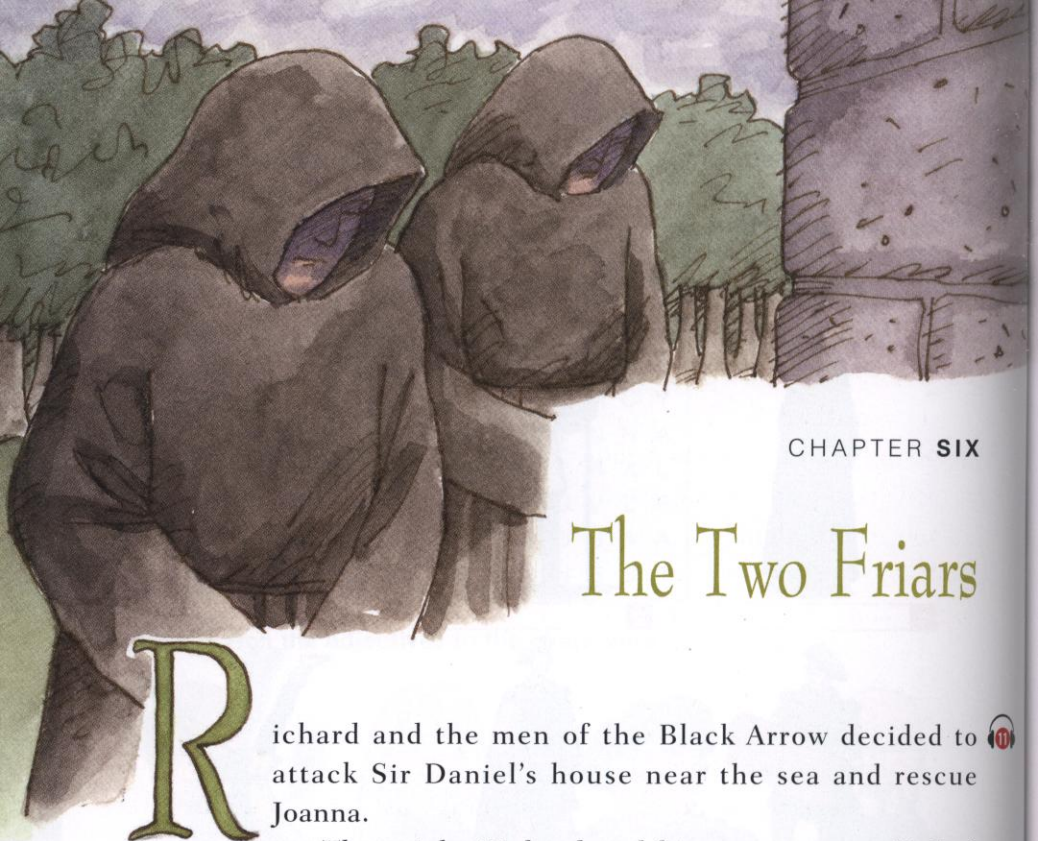

'Sir Daniel's castle in Shoreby – but why?' asked Richard.

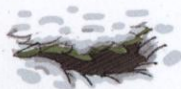
'Master Shelton!' cried Lawless. 'Joanna is now in his castle and she'll soon marry old Lord Shoreby! Now do you understand?'

Knights and the Knighthood Today

 Today the title 'knight' refers to people who receive this honour from the king or queen. It is a 'thank you' for good services to the country. But in the Middle Ages a knight was a soldier who fought for the king and the country.

Knights in the Middle Ages almost always came from noble families. They had a high position¹ in society and worked for lords or directly

for the king. When they went into battle they wore heavy armour and rode strong horses. They carried a special shield with their family's symbol, called a coat of arms.

When they weren't fighting in battles, knights often practised their skills by going to tournaments.² These were big competitions and there were several different sports including jousting.³

Boys learnt how to become a knight from the age of seven. These young boys were called 'pages'. They learnt about horses and armour, and how to fight with a wooden sword. When they were around twelve they became 'squires'. A squire learnt how to fight from a real knight. He also helped the knight do many things, including putting on his armour before going into battle.

Today's knights do not need to fight and they do not have a specific job to do. The special honour is called a knighthood. In Great Britain, these awards are given twice a year. If you are knighted by the queen, you are then invited to a special ceremony¹ at Buckingham Palace. Here you kneel in front of the Queen and she touches your shoulders with a sword. A British man can then use 'Sir' before his name, and a British woman can use 'Dame' before hers. Sometimes the Queen awards an honorary knighthood to non-British citizens. These people are knighted but they cannot officially use the title. Recent examples are Bob Geldof and Bill Gates. Often non-famous people are given a knighthood to say 'thank you' for their charity² work.

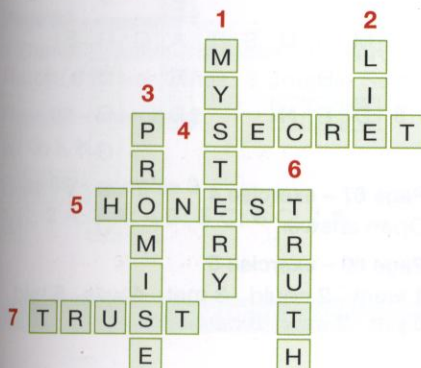
