


They don't like Cinderella, and she has to do all the work in the house.


They throw their clothes on the floor.

Cinderella runs upstairs into the living room.


'Here I am!' she says.

Cinderella opens the door. 'Can I put on the shoe?' she says.


'GO AWAY!' say the ugly sisters.

'The shoe is yours!' says Prince Charming. 'You are the beautiful princess!'


'I'm not a princess. I'm Cinderella,' she says. 'But the shoe is mine'.
