




















It's three o'clock. It's time for the race!

The hare runs ahead very quickly. The other animals can't see him. He's in the forest!


The tortoise walks, slowly but surely.

The hare can't see the tortoise.


'He's so slow! I can stop and wait for him,' says the hare.

He puts his paw on the mouse's tail and opens his mouth. He wants to eat the mouse!


'Squeak! Squeak! I'm very sorry,' says the mouse. 'Please, don't eat me!'

ROAR! ROAR!! ROAR!!!





















Quickly, run!' shouts the town mouse. 'We must hide!'
