
# Ali Baba and the Forty Thieves

Retold by Catherine E. White Illustrated by Tullia Masinari









Ali Baba was a woodcutter. He was from Persia, in the Middle East.




Ali Baba's wife, Nasreen, was in the kitchen. Ali Baba told her about the forty thieves and the treasure in the cave.

Ali's brother, Cassim, was outside the kitchen. He opened the door.






Cassim went to the rock. 'Open Sesame,' he said. He went into the cave and the rock closed.


Ali went to the rock. It was closed but he heard a noise. 'Cassim, are you there?' he said.


'Yes, yes... I'm here. Help me! I'm hurt.'


'Open Sesame,' said Ali Baba and the rock opened.


Cassim was on the floor... he couldn't walk! 'The thieves said I must die but I didn't die!' he said.

'You didn't die but you're hurt! Let's go home now and the doctor can come to the house later tonight.'













The next day Cassim and Ali Baba went back to the rock with ten grey donkeys.


'Open Wheat,' said Cassim.
