
Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs

Retold by Catherine E. White Illustrated by Alida Massari








Snow White's mother died when she was a little baby. She lived happily with her father, the King, in the castle.

'Thank you,' said Snow White. 'I love walking in the forest! I can pick some flowers for you, too.'




The next morning Queen Bella called the woodcutter. 'You must go into the forest with Snow White,' she said 'and you must kill her!'

'Let's look in the bedroom,' said the thinnest dwarf.


They opened the bedroom door quietly, but Snow White woke up.

'Are you a fairy?' asked the youngest dwarf.




Snow White told the seven dwarfs about her walk in the forest with the woodcutter. She told them that Queen Bella wanted to kill her.


'Thank you.' said Snow White. 'What lovely, shiny red apples!'


Snow White ate a small piece of an apple.

They found the cottage in the forest.


'Snow White's dead,' said the youngest dwarf.
