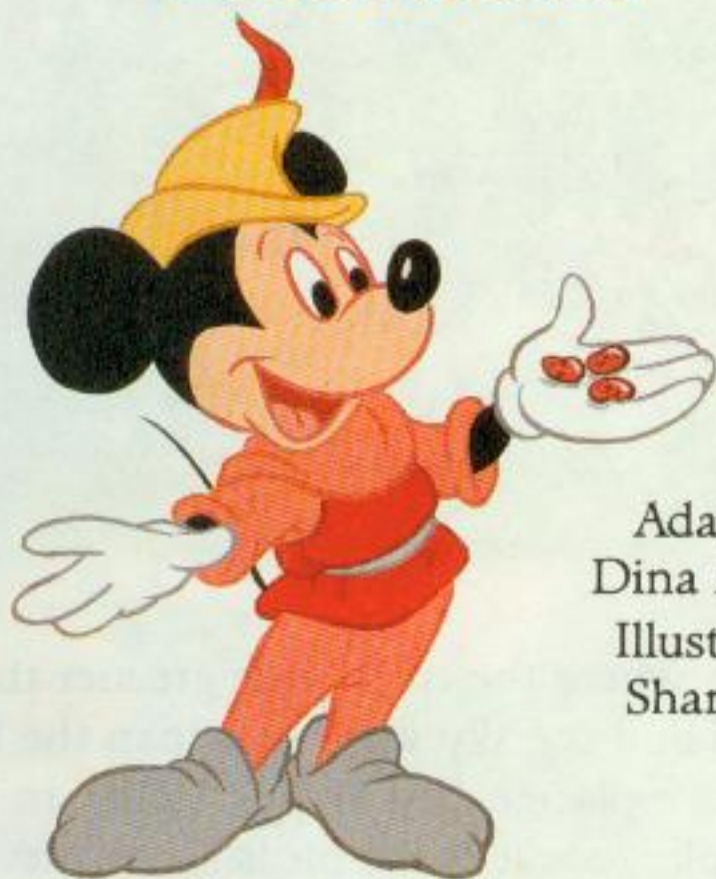

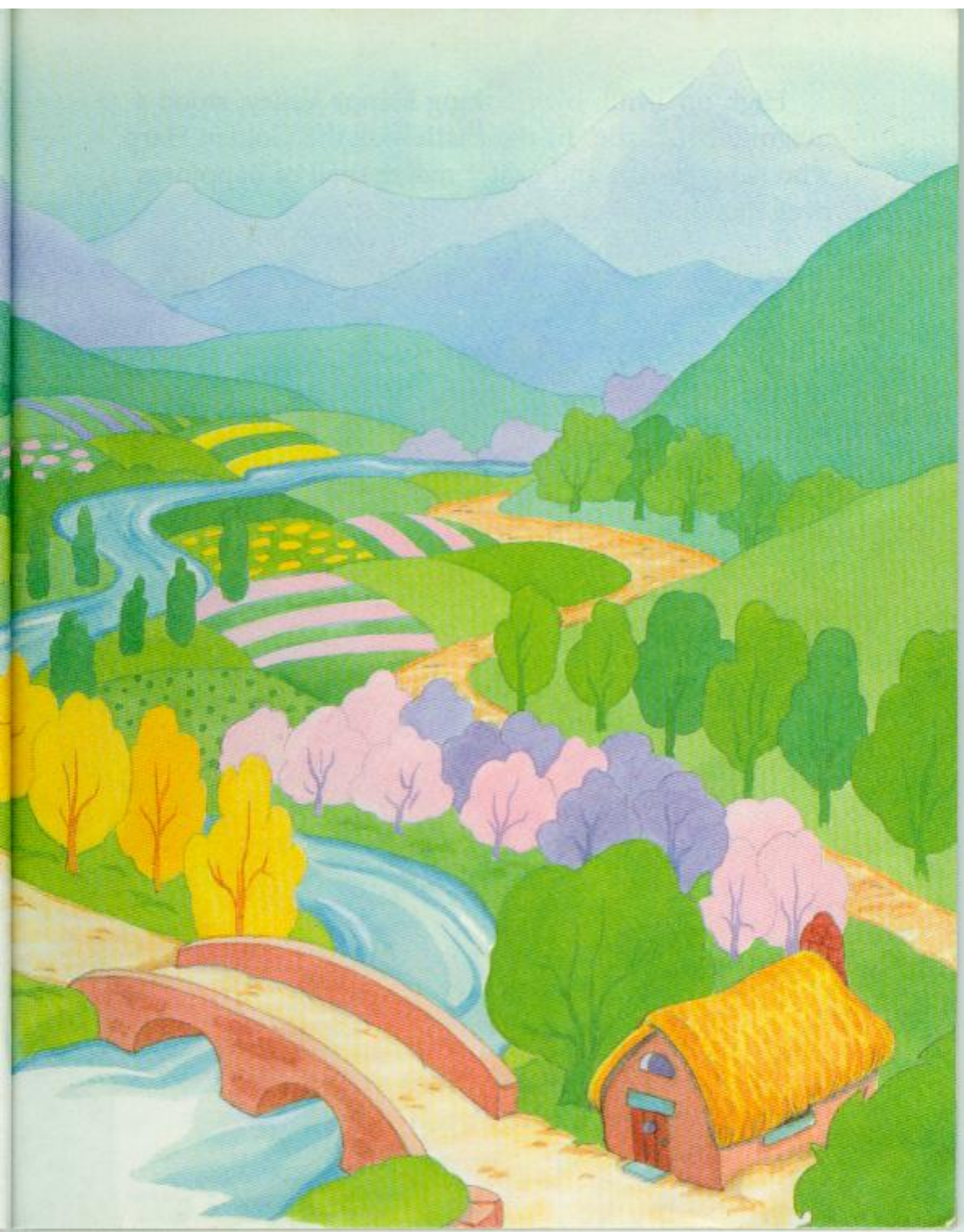

The farmers whistled and hummed as they did their chores. Children sang as they skipped to school. In Happy Valley every day was a happy day.

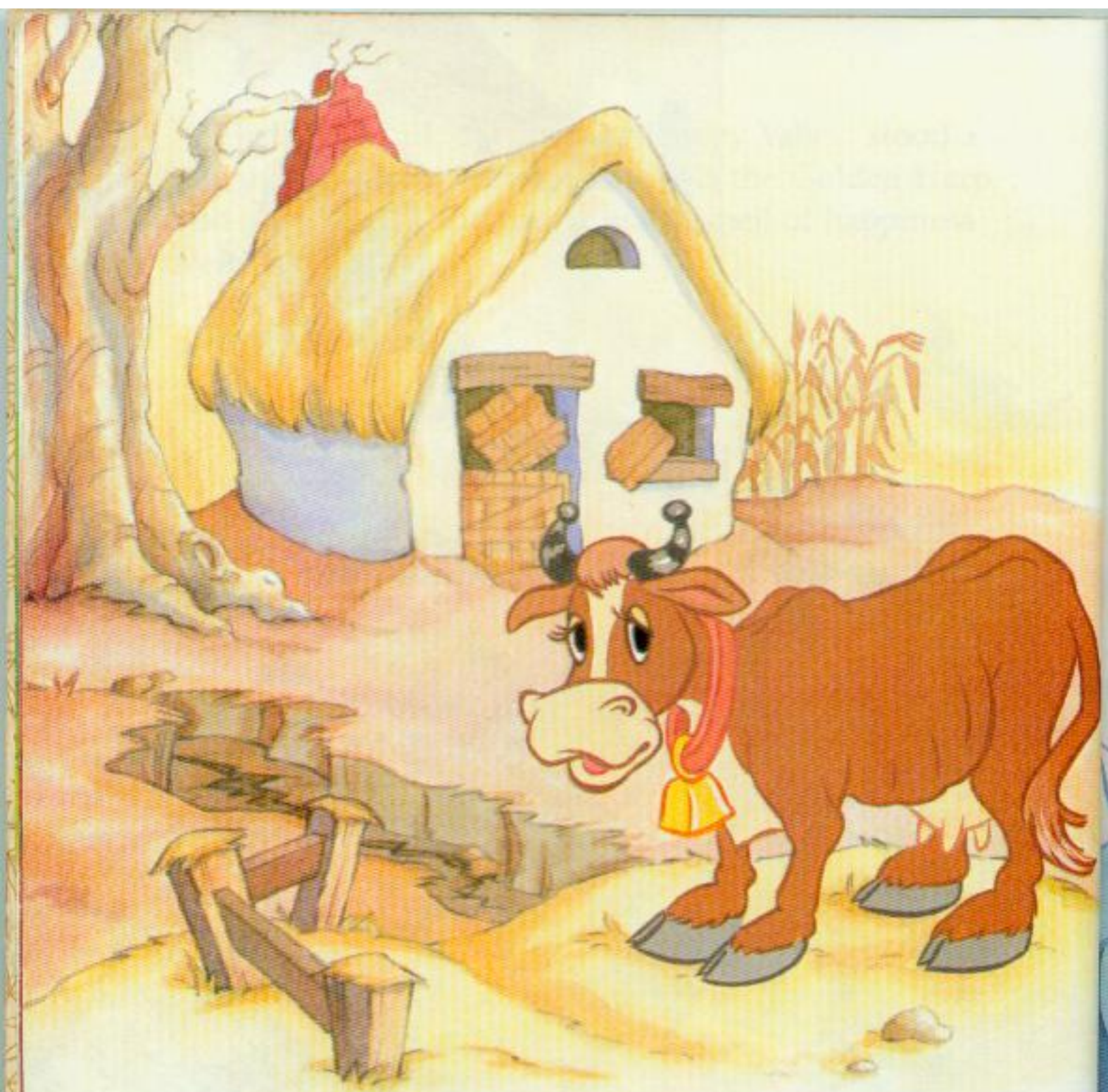

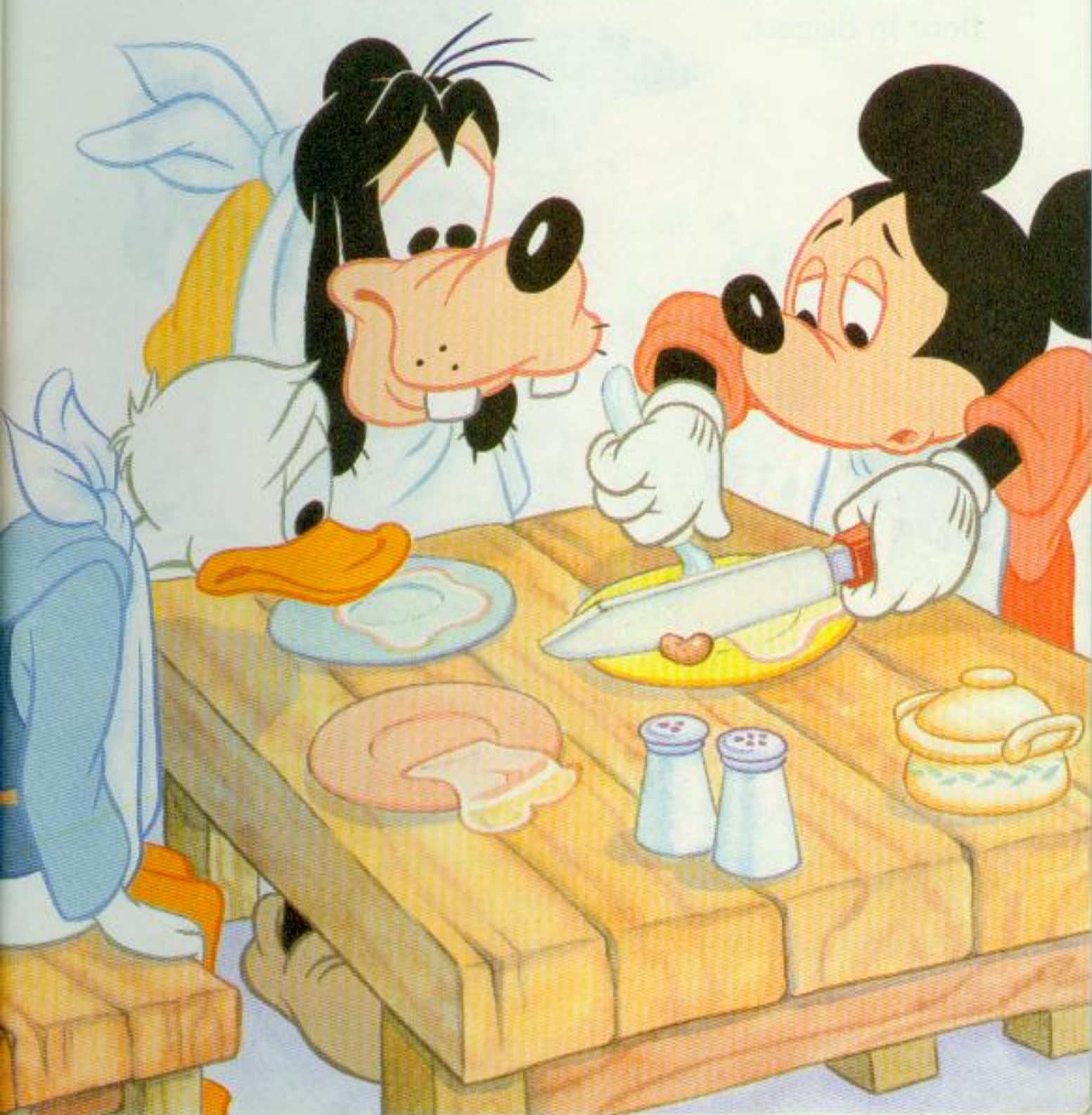


But one day a terrible thing happened in Happy Valley. Someone stole the Golden Harp from the castle, and the magic spell of happiness was gone.

The beans sprouted and began to grow. They grew into a stalk that lifted the house. The beanstalk climbed all the way up to the sky.

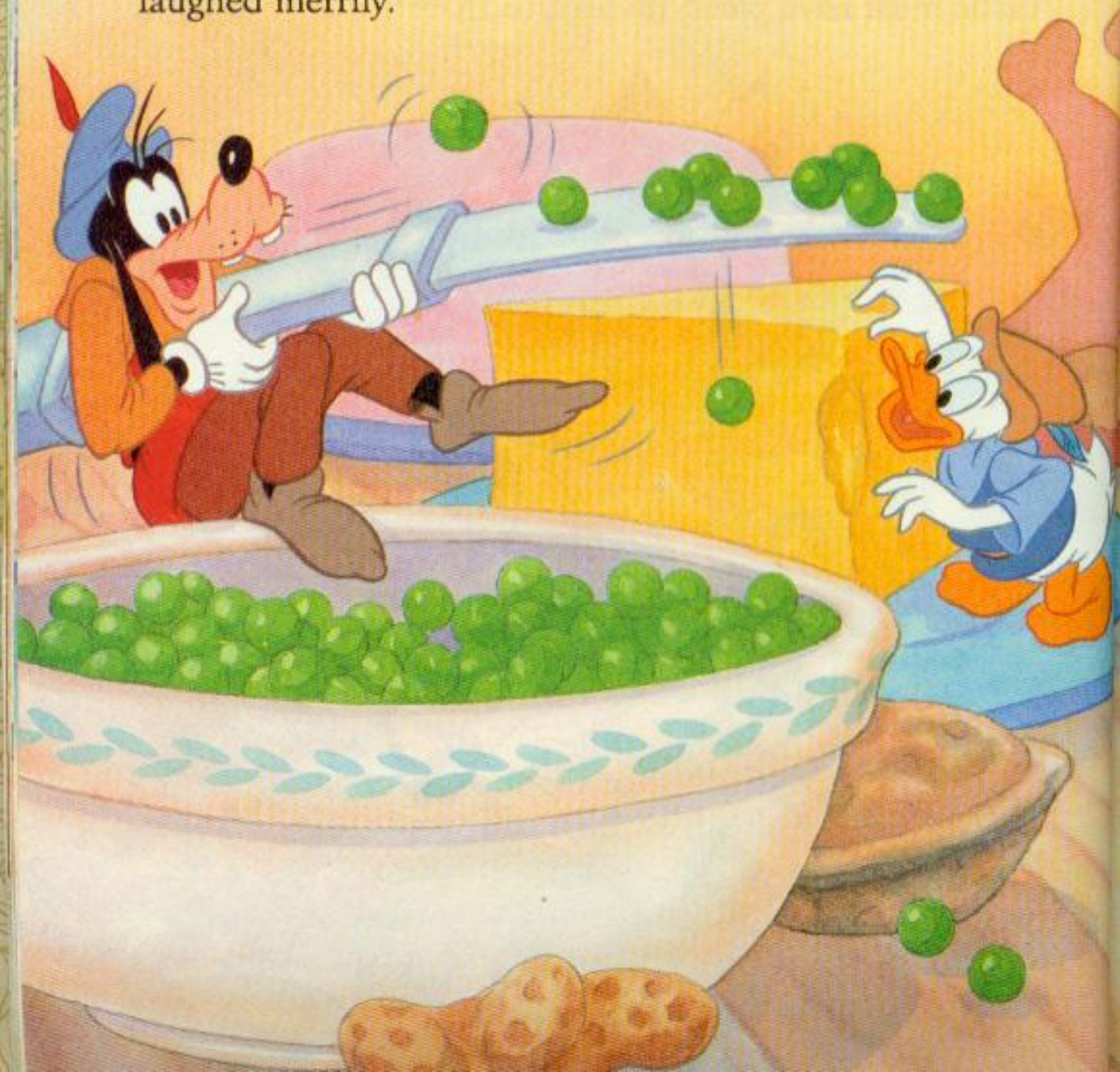
In the morning the hungry farmers woke up and looked out the window.

"It came from in there," said Donald, pointing to a box that was on the table.

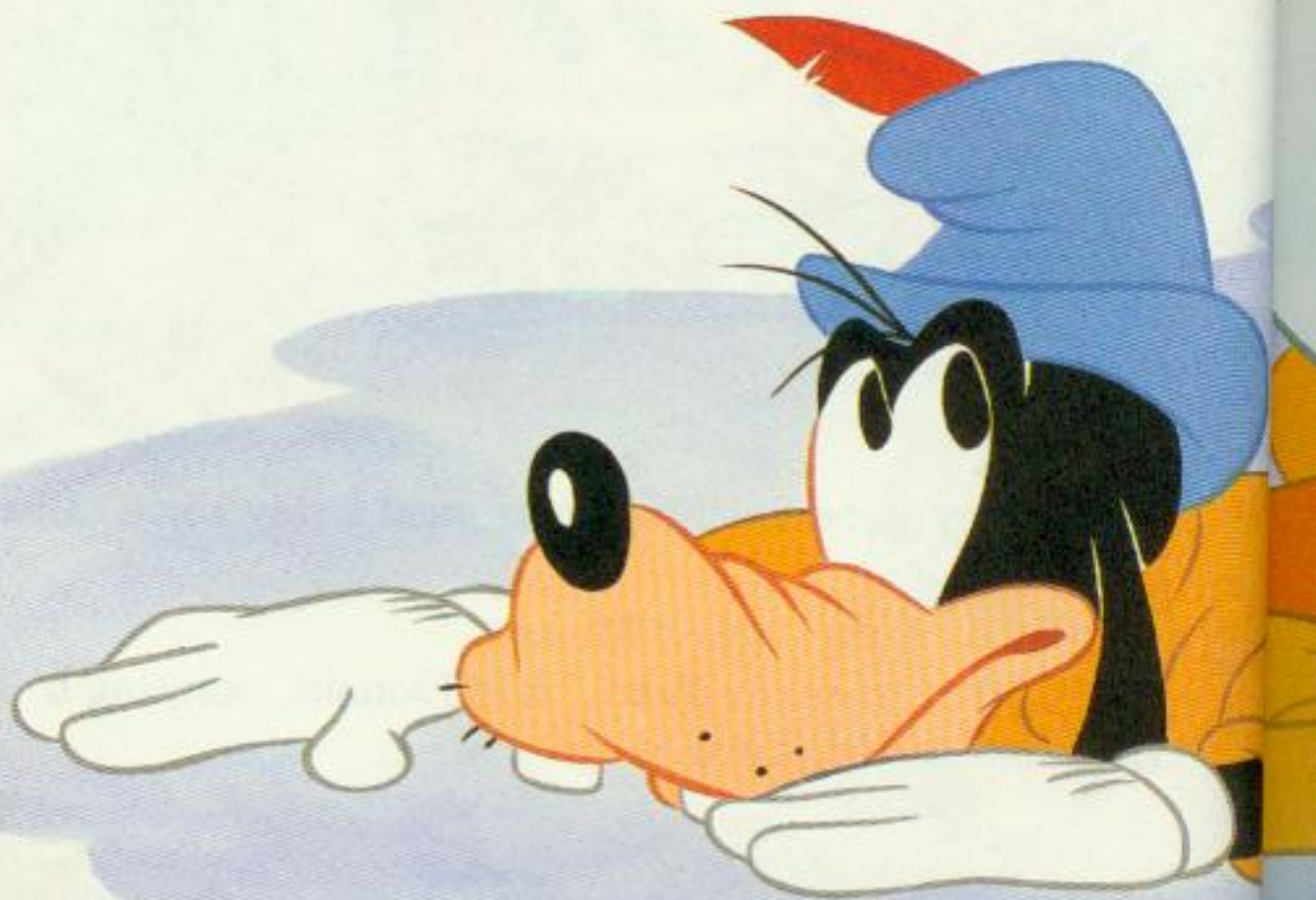
Mickey, Donald, and Goofy moved closer to the box. "Who are you?" they asked.

Mickey, Donald, and Goofy ran as quickly as they could to hide from the evil giant.

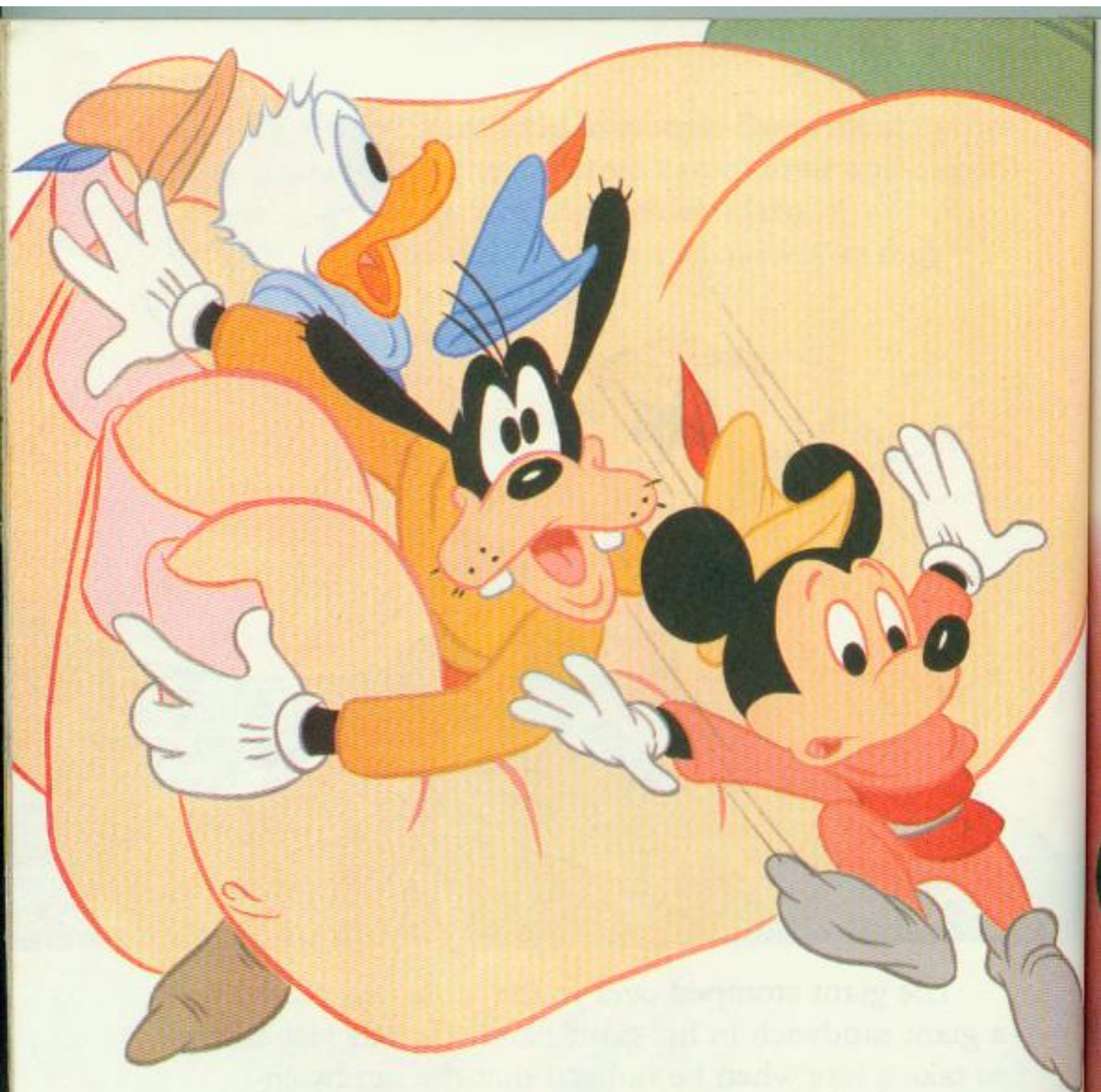




The giant stomped over to the table and picked up a giant sandwich in his giant hand. He was just about to take a bite when he noticed that the sandwich was moving.

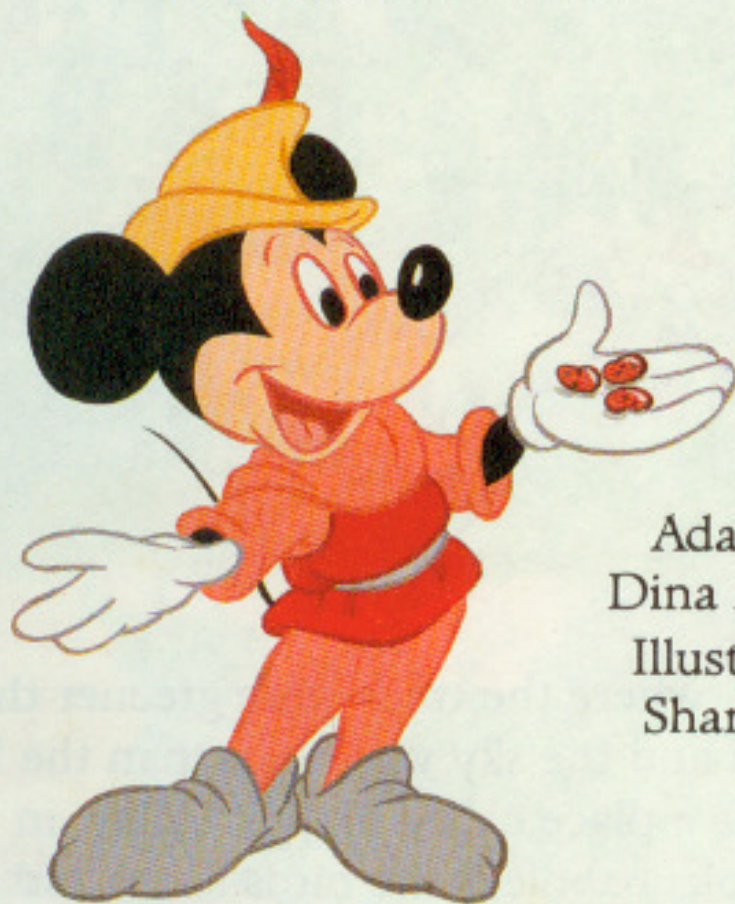
