

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


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Good morning, class.





Tigerlets are available in patterned or plain, in a variety of shapes and styles.




Press them in the middle to find their hidden squeaker.



At the end of their tentacles, Earth Tigerlets grow sharp thorns. They use these thorns to attack the wooden monsters that live inside the earthdwelling.



Or to help them climb up steep surfaces.



Earth Tigerlets love gardening. First they dig a hole. Then they plant brown stinkseeds. These stinkseeds never grow.




Earth Tigerlets are happy to plant stinkseeds wherever it is convenient inside the earthdwelling, too.



Earth Tigerlets like to have breakfast at exactly 5:00 A.M. To remind the sleeping Earthling that it is time to eat, they lower themselves onto his nose.




When the Earthling begins to prepare the meatglop, the Tigerlet turns on a small motor inside her suit.




Generally the Tigerlet will try to save some meatglop on her antennae in case she needs a snack between meals.



Earth Tigerlets also dine upon cowjuice, fried cluck bird, sea wigglers, and green gravy from the large cans that the Earthling places outside.



Earth Tigerlets can hear a package of breakfast piglinks being opened an earth mile away.



They cannot, however, hear an Earthlet yelling "Here, kitty!" from the yard next door.



Earth Tigerlets cannot stand Earth Hounds. When they see one coming, they fold in half and puff air into their rudder. Then they launch into orbit with a hiss and a crackle.



Earth Tigerlets like the golden fishstick, a small relative of the sea wiggler. The Earthlet bathes the fishstick in a glass capsule, along with some vegetables and tiny chips of sidewalk.




The Earth Tigerlet helps clean the fishstick by quickly stirring the bath with his mitten.
