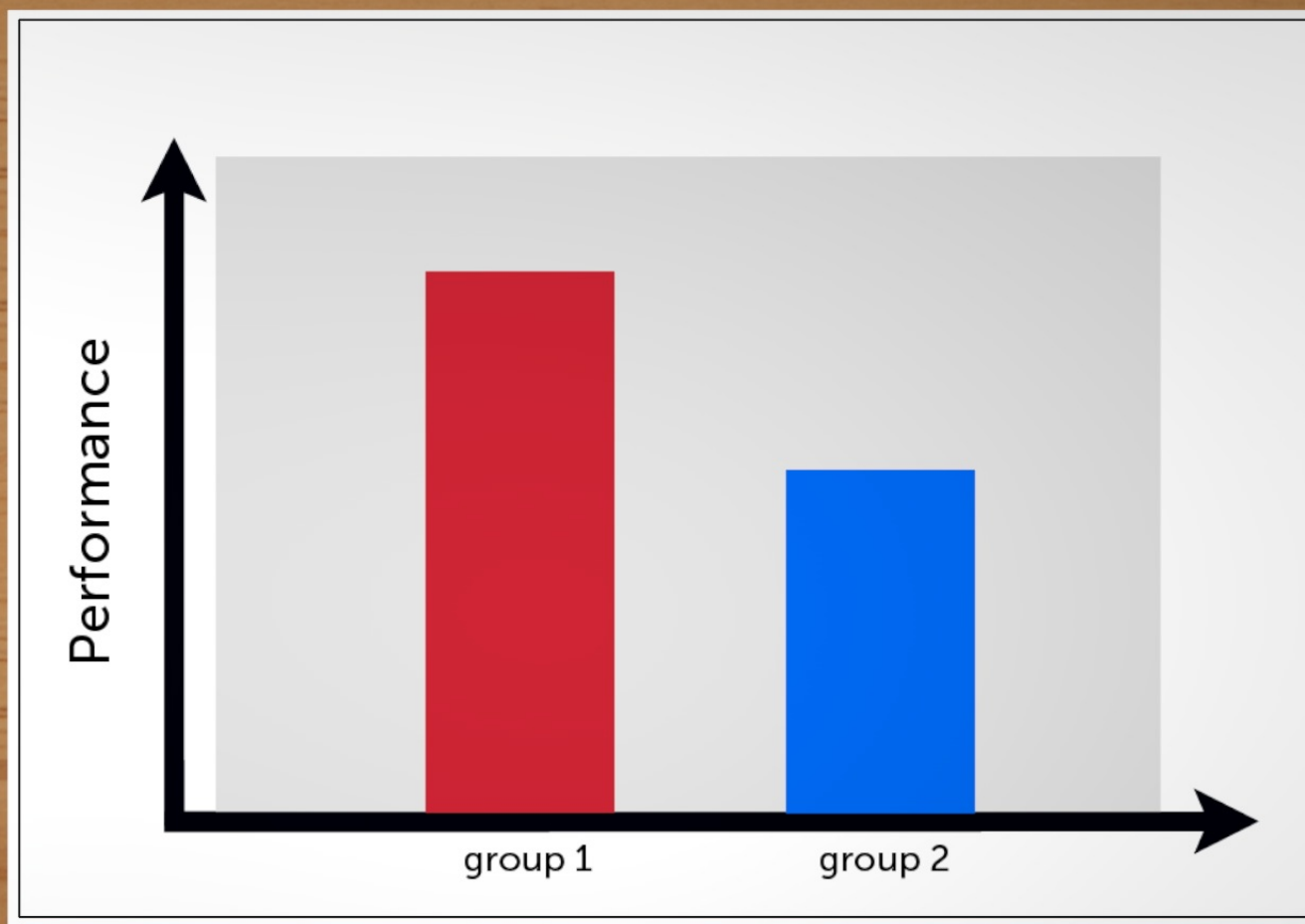


The advisor

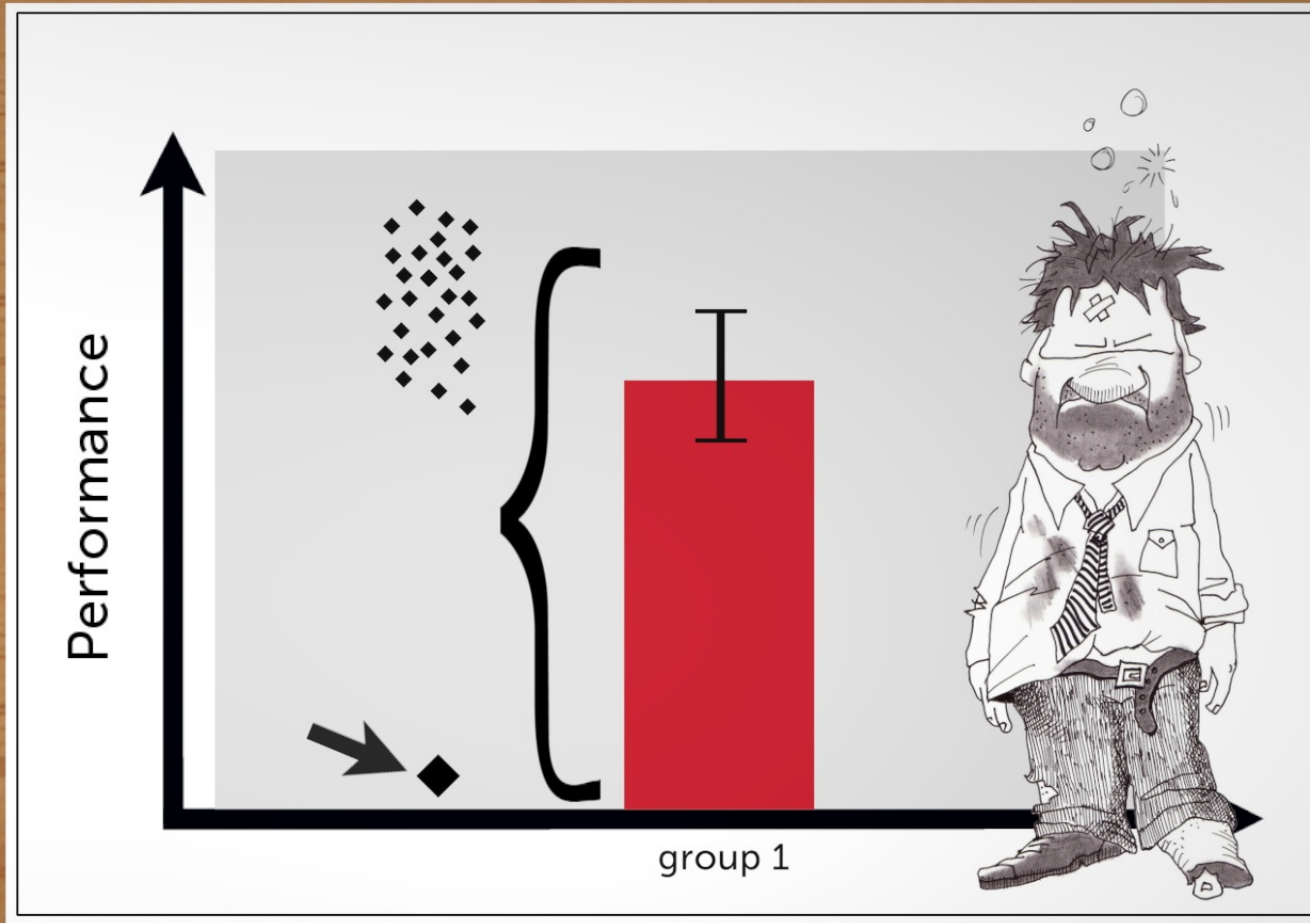


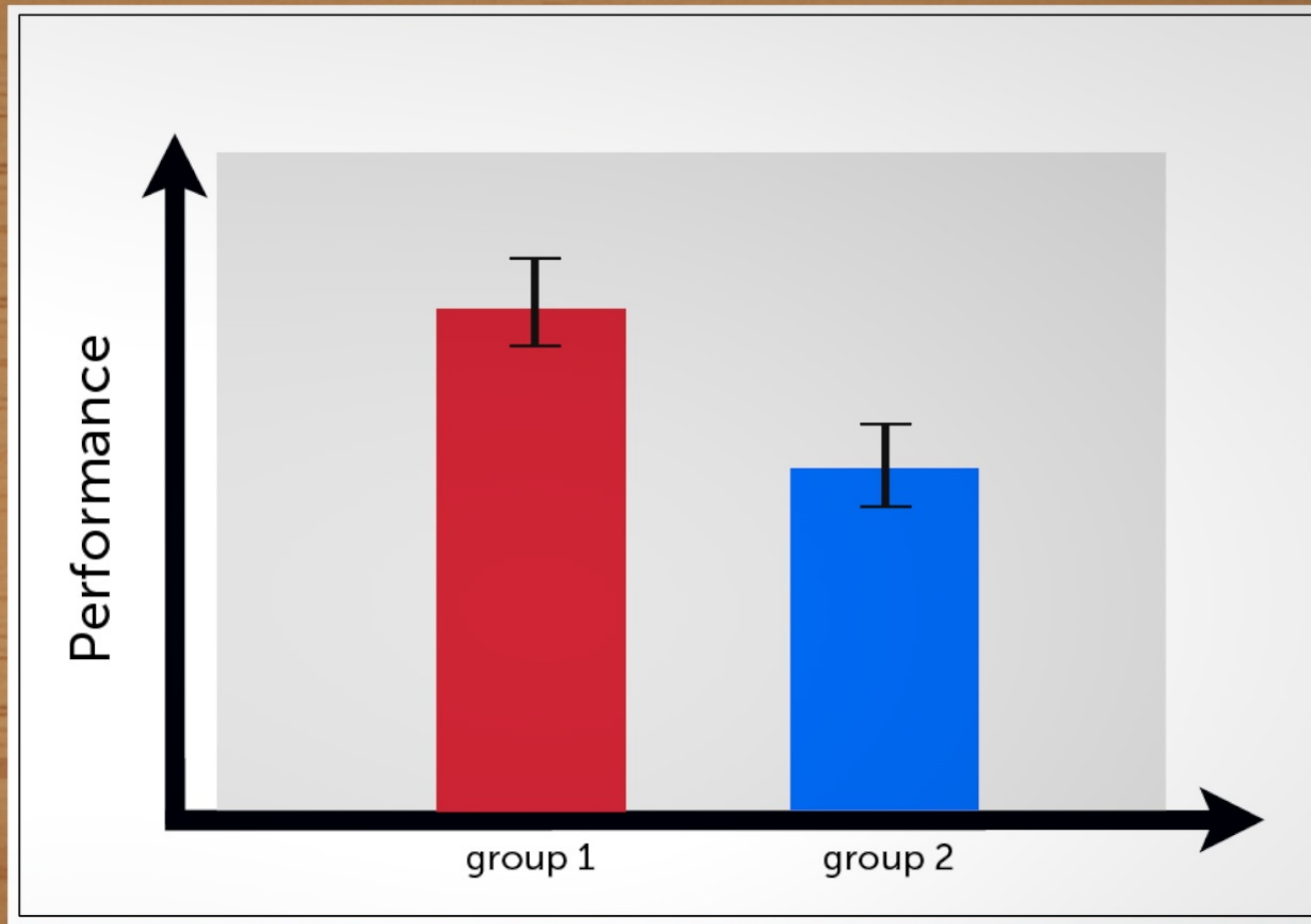


Our own interests
